Audience members who favored limiting U.S. involvement to non-military assistance sat on the right side of the room and those who favored military involvement sat on the left.

Brent Brossmann, an English junior from Bryan, delivered the first of two seven-minute prepared speeches.

Brossmann, who argued against military involvement, argued first that if U.S. involvement continues in El Salvador, history will replay itself and the U.S. will be faced with another

Brossmann said, "The people of El Salvador believe we will fight their fight for them.'

Brossmann then argued that a peaceful solution would have the best response.

"The Salvadorans are willing to negotiate, all they want is to have no more murders, to be able to keep their land and to have equal representation in their own country. This, to me, is true democracy.


