Susan Davis, the wife of South Salt Lake Mayor James W. Davis, went on strike against her children last Thursday and demanded the kids help more around the house


After a three-day stalemate, the attitude. two sides worked out an agreement Sunday and the children each signed contracts at the family bargaining table in the dining


