OFFICIAL NOTICE

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974 DIRECTORY INFORMATION

To comply with the requirements of the "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974," Texas A&M University must periodically announce publicly the policies and procedures implementing the act. Additional information is available from the Office of the Registrar.

The different types of student records are maintained in various university offices and the chief administrator in each of these offices is responsible for them.

responsible for them.

Generally, with certain exceptions, the law provides that students and former students have the right to review their records, request explanations concerning them, obtain copies and challenge records which they feel are inaccurate, misleading or otherwise inappropriate. The challenge procedure includes a full and fair opportunity for the student to present relevant evidence at a hearing. The law also provides that students may waive their right of access to confidential letters of recommendation and may also grant permission to release certain personally identifiable information.

The exception to this law, i.e., records not accessible to students.

The exception to this law, i.e., records not accessible to students, include educational personnel records in the sole possession of the author, records maintained for law enforcement purposes, employment records of non-students, records maintained by a physician, psychiatrist or psychologist and financial records of a student's parents

The law also provides that in addition to University employees having a "legitimate educational interest," certain other governmental and quasi-governmental agencies and parents certifying that a student is carried as a dependent for income tax purposes may have access to student records

student records.

The University can release "directory information" (such as name, address, telephone listing, major field of study, classification, date and place of birth, participation in activities and sports, height and weight of athletic team members and degrees and awards received, etc.); however, students may request that this information be withheld.

To request that such "directory information" be withheld by the University from public disclosure through such means as certification of enrollment, the campus directory, address and telephone lists for university organizations, etc., a student must complete and sign the proper from in the Office of the Registrar.

The student must realize that approximately one month is needed to remove this information from materials already in circulation. However, the campus directory is printed only once a year, and after printing, no

The student is responsible for renewing this request each September, and the validity of the requests extends from the date of the request to the following September 1st.



Prosecutors ready case for police murder trial

ALBUQUERQUE - Prosecutors put the finishing touches on their case Wednesday in the first-degree murder trial of a man accused of shooting a policeman to death last February.

Joel Lee Compton, 30, of Mesquite, was charged immediately after the Feb. 24 slaying of Officer Gerald Cline, 35. Cline, an 11 year veteran officer, was gunned down while investigating a disturbance call at a motel.

A nurse who drew Compton's blood for a blood-alcohol test and a policeman who helped handcuff him both testified Tuesday they believe he was aware of what was sample from Compton. happening immediately after Cline was shot.

Compton's public defenders admit he shot the policeman, but claim he was too drunk to know what he was doing. He had been drinking heavily all that day and had a blood-alcohol level of .20 right after the shooting.
