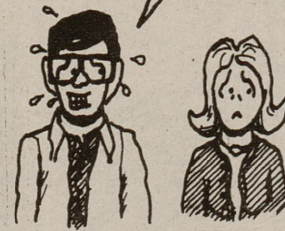
Nightmares: The latest of the horror movies. This one is conceptually different than most however. The horror of this one is that it plays with scaring you with your own fears. Rated R.
