

Lecture series opens today

Dr. Ralph Landau will give the year's first University Lecture on "Technology, Economics, and Public Policy" at 2 p.m. today in Rudder Forum.

Landau, a chemical engineer, has been recognized by The Economist magazine as "one of America's most successful entrepreneurs." He holds nearly 50 patents on technical products and has published more than 90 papers and two books.

The Philadelphia native

graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 1937 with a bachelor of science degree and in 1941 from Massachusetts Institute of Technology as a doctor of science, both in chemical engineering.

Landau has lectured at several major universities and accumulated a lengthy list of awards and honors in the engineering field. Landau was recognized as an "eminent chemical engineer" in 1983 by the American Institute of Chemical Engineers.

Landau is the first of four lecturers on the University Lecture Series' agenda for the 1983-84 school year. His speech is sponsored by the College of Engineering.

The University Lecture Series committee is comprised of one faculty member from each college and one from the Sterling C. Evans Library. Two students — and sometimes three — also serve on the committee.

Dr. Donald McDonald, interim deputy provost for engineering and a member of the

University Lecture Series committee, said it sponsors four lectures every year. The first three are sponsored by various colleges on campus and the last one sponsored by the Texas A&M faculty.

"The colleges sponsoring lectures are chosen in alphabetical order," McDonald said. The College of Engineering, College of Geosciences and College of Liberal Arts will have guest speakers this year.

The lecture is free to the public.

Class required to cut bonfire

Anyone planning to cut bonfire must attend one of the safety classes at 4 p.m. or 7 p.m. on Sept. 26, 27, or 28, head civilian and senior coordinator of bonfire Mark Hackfeld said.

Hackfeld explained that the classes are one of the safety reports outlined in a safety report written this fall by Corps of Cadets bonfire coordinator Albert Eby.

The only way to receive a bonfire cutting card is to attend one of the classes, he said.

"I don't care how many times you've been out to cut bonfire," he said. "This year you need to come to the class to receive another card."

The classes include demonstrations on ax safety and chainsaw usage, as well as how to cut down trees and limbs.

"A lot of it covers ax safety because that's the main tool we use," Hackfeld said.

The free classes, held at The Grove, will last 30 minutes and cover all aspects of bonfire safety, Hackfeld said.

In compiling the safety report, Eby worked with safety engineer Dr. Gary Nelson, who observed the cutting site and outlined the risks, Hackfeld said.

"He pointed out the high risk areas, and we eliminated those," Hackfeld said. For example, people can no longer ride to the site on the back of flatbed or wheelbar trucks.

"It was always a big deal to ride on the trucks," Hackfeld said. "But it was a high risk and was eliminated."

Safety measures taken on the lower risk problems also help reduce the number of accidents last year, Hackfeld said.

"At bonfire last year, there were 53.7 percent less accidents than the previous year," he said.

Much of that has to do with the safety classes, Hackfeld said, and this year there should be an even bigger decrease in accidents.

Along with safety measures, the report covers the organization and supervision of bonfire, Hackfeld said.

"There is pretty extensive supervision over the drums," he said. A drum that brings 40 to 50 people out to cut should have at least five people supervising them at all times, he said.

"Most of the accidents come from people just playing around," Hackfeld said.

About 3,500 people are expected to be cutting for bonfire this year, he said.

"We're looking for a good turnout this year and we want everything to be safe," he said.
