> In 1980, Texas A&M had 194 merit scholars and was ranked 14th nationally, but in the 1981-82 academic year, the school gained more scholars than any other school. The number in the total student body went from 235 to 325.

In an interview with The Houston Post, Texas A&M University President Frank E. Vandiver, said the University was able to compete with other universities in obtaining merit scholars because of the scholarships

they were able to offer.
The National Merit Scholarship Corp. is a non-profit organization based in Evanston, Ill. It finances about 1,800 scholarships annually valued at \$1.8 million.
