# 'Gratifying to be back' ZZ Top enjoys Texas

**DALLAS**—ZZ Top is back on top. Maybe they're just slow, but it has been four years since the hard rock group had a hit with Tres Hombres, which went gold in 1979. In the middle of a red-hot tour to promote their "Eliminator" album which just went platinum, bassist Dusty Hill said he's happy to be back in his native Texas.

and immediately sold out so the band decided to stay one more day to satisfy their Dallas fans. A third concert was set for the Oct. 1.

Dusty said he's not sure what the band will be doing after the tour. They probably will follow their old pattern, writing enough material until they have enough for a new album. No one person of the three-man group dominates the songwriting, said Dusty.

"It's just Gibbons, Beard and Hill. That's just the way we do it."

Reflecting upon the life of a touring musician, Dusty said that he would always rather be doing something other than what he's doing at the moment.

"When I gotta get up at 5 a.m. to make an early plane, I'd rather be in the studio. When it

gets to grindin' in the studio, man, give me the open road," he said. And when the band is out on the open road, does the band drive their trademark auto?

"That car's too tough for real driving. I stick to my DeLorean to get around. But ain't that baby somethin'?"

The bright red 1934 Ford coupe which adorns the cover of "Eliminator" has become somewhat of a trademark.

"It was just something we were interested in, and it became a part of our act," Dusty said.

The car has appeared in several videos. "Eliminator" was the first time the band has ventured into videos.

Videos are "not a toy anymore," Dusty said. "It's an art

form." He said the band enjoys making their videos.

"We just sat there looking in front of this bar background with nothing else around. The rest of the video for "Star Dressed Man" was filmed with actors and models and was spliced together later, "just like the movies," said Dusty. Videos have been excellent promoters for the band, something they tend to continue.

The fact that ZZ Top is on MTV is unusual. Most bands predominate in medium. Most groups have a copy of the video to MTV cable television channel devoted to musical videos. The popularity of MTV almost ensures success of the groups it promotes. ZZ Top, however, is really a new wave band.

# NBC sweeps Emmy prizes

**HOLLYWOOD**—NBC president Grant Tinker said Monday, "We did okay," of the 33 Emmys his network won in Sunday's TV academy, sweeping rivals ABC and CBS.

"But I don't think the show will stop. As some wise man once said, 'It's only television.'" Rivers called Watt an "idiot" and used the expression "damned audience" during course of the show.

NBC dominated both weekly comedy and drama awards with the low-rated "Cheers" winning five Emmys and "Hill Street Blues" adding to its record-breaking total for the past three seasons with six awards.

Later the comedian said she didn't regret her comment. She added, "He is an idiot. She blamed her profanity on nervous slip."

"The Thorn Birds," based on Colleen McCullough's novel, won four awards of ABC's five major awards. Only actress Tyne Daley's award for best actress in a drama series (Cagney & Lacy) prevented a complete shut-out of major Emmys for CBS.

"Hill Street Blues," which captured 14 Emmys in its two seasons, won awards for best drama series, acting, directing, film-sound editing and film and sound editing. None of its stars won awards.

Tinker was almost noncommittal about the storm of controversy involving Emmy show hostess Joan Rivers whose jokes about minority groups, Interior Secretary James Watt and profanity had hundreds of viewers calling to complain.

Newcomer Shelley Long won the award for best actress in a comedy series despite its season-long ranking near the bottom of the Nielsen ratings.

"It's a little early to determine whether we had a major reaction," Tinker said. "We were trying to take the Emmy show out of the scripted, formal bag and get some spontaneity with Eddie Murphy and Miss Rivers as hosts."

The Dickens classic "Nicholas Nickleby" won the Emmy outstanding limited series "Special Bulletin," a terrific story of the media and an outstanding drama special of the year.

"I think we succeeded admirably," Tinker said. "When you do that you take some chances. Had some of the remarks been scripted we would have taken them out. We walk a thin line in those cases."

"Motown 25: Yesterday, Today, Forever" won the Emmy for best variety, music or comedy program of the year.

The 35th annual TV academy awards, which ran more than three hours, was a triumph for veteran Barbara Stanwyck, who won the Emmy for best actress in a limited series or special for her role as the grand dame of "Thorn Birds."

"Tech on a Tuesday" won the Emmy for best game show.
