Theatre Arts play good for a laugh

 "What the Butler Saw" is a farce," says Allen Rudolph, who is Sergeant Match in the play. "It's something that you can sit back and have a good laugh with."

The British comedy by Joe Orton, is the theater arts program first production for the 1983-84 season; it will run Sept. 28, 29, 30 and Oct. 1 in Rudder Theater. The play is about the events occurring in an insane asylum.

The resident psychiatrist tries to seduce a young job applicant, gets caught in the act and attempts to lie his way out of the predicament. He causes more trouble than he starts with.

Mary Ann Mitchell, an assistant professor of English who is helping with the production, says the play is a parody of extremes. The characters in the play are literally taking off their costumes, she says, and putting on others in their search for identities. The people have problems defining themselves, she says.

There is meaning for today in the play, she says. The people are faced with the extremes of behavior in promiscuity, rape and incest, she says, and these are dealt with by the play. In addition they can't make honest contact with each other, Mitchell says, or even have honest relations.

There is no butler in the play. The butler, Mitchell says, is the audience, who is being shown how the cultured class falls apart.

"The appearance of being normal is destroyed," she says. "The characters are reduced to uncultured behavior; animal instincts take over, which is not what we associate with the developed English."

Members of the audience who are shocked should be Mitchell says. "What the Butler Saw" shows society's ill, she says, because Orton wants the audience to react and do something to correct them.

The play is a simple production, she says, because the characters and their dialogue are most important.

Richard Strayer plays Dr. Prentice, the seducing doctor. Elizabeth Smith plays Geradine Barclay, who is the doctor's innocent victim. Anne Suite plays Mrs. Prentice, the doctor's nymphomaniac wife. Mark Mitchell plays Nicholas Beckett, the bellhop who tries to rape Mrs. Prentice. Fred Phillips plays Dr. Rance, the visiting psychiatrist who certifies everyone but himself insane. Allen Rudolph plays Sergeant Match, a slow policeman who tries too hard to do his job.

Oklahoma governor speaks on prisons

 AUSTIN — Oklahoma Gov. George Nigh, reflecting on events surrounding a prison riot in his state last month, Tuesday told fellow Southern governors there were no solutions to prison problems and no such thing as "riot-proof" penitentiaries.

"There is no solution to the prison problem in Oklahoma, and I presume there is no solution to the prison problem in your state," Nigh told members of the Southern Governors Association.

Nigh said a riot last month at a "model" penitentiary in Hominy, Okla., exemplified many problems common to correctional systems across the nation — overcrowding, inmate idleness and the growing tendency of judges to send more criminals to prison for longer periods of time.

Although the Oklahoma prison system had trimmed overcrowding and had undergone major improvements over the past several years, Nigh said the Hominy riot — in which one inmate died and 35 inmates and three guards were injured — occurred despite all precautions.


Nigh urged governors to return to their states and assess their capabilities of responding to a prison riot.

Texas Gov. Mark Whitely agreed there were no concrete solutions to prison problems but said "the least expensive and most socially productive" way to improve prison systems was to improve educational systems.
