UIL director plugs drastic sports cuts

AUSTIN — The director of the University Interscholastic League recommended drastic cutbacks Wednesday in public school athletic programs — including prohibiting sports events on school nights — that he said took too much time away from students' studies.

Dr. Bailey Marshall, director of the organization that governs most extracurricular competitions in secondary schools, admitted to the Select Committee on Education that Texas schools' strong emphasis on athletics might be interfering with education.

claimed was an overemphasis by schools on sports and other non-academic school programs. Chairman H. Ross Perot praised Marshall's recommendations as "courageous."

Marshall, who said the UIL would consider his recommendations at an Oct. 16 meeting, suggested other extracurricular events such as band contests and speech tournaments should be curtailed.

The UIL director's recommendations included:

- Studying the possibility of eliminating interschool competitions in junior high grades, allowing only intramural sports in junior highs.
- Eliminating the practice of "red-shirting," in which student athletes are forced to repeat grades in order to improve their athletic abilities for use in higher grades, by requiring any student held back in the seventh grade

or beyond to lose a year of sports eligibility.

- Trimming the number of games allowed to be played in basketball, baseball, volleyball and soccer.
- Reducing the amount of school year time spent on tennis and golf and moving participation in those sports to the summer months.
- Prohibiting students who are failing a course to miss a day in that course in order to participate in a UIL-sponsored event.
- Adding no new athletic programs to UIL competition for five years and studying the possibility of eliminating some existing sports programs.
- Forbidding schools to purchase unnecessary sports equipment.
- Penalizing coaches or organization sponsors who violate UIL rules.

"I did a lot of soul-searching last night," Marshall told the committee before making his suggestions for cutbacks. "In the climate I'm reading, we won't have them (school sports) if we don't control them."

The committee has been critical of what some members

HOUSTON — Continental Airlines pilots union leaders met Wednesday to consider trying to shut Continental down with a strike because of pay cuts and workload increases implemented in a bankruptcy reorganization.

On Thursday, representatives of all 46 airline units of ALPA were scheduled to meet in Houston to consider industry-wide action.
