

Filing will begin Monday for Class of '87 officers

Freshmen who want to run for senator positions and class officers can file for the election Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Eight senator positions are open in addition to president, vice president, treasurer, secretary and social secretary positions for the class of '87.

Senators will represent the views of their constituents to

members of the Student Senate at bi-weekly meetings. They also are expected to participate on one of the five legislative committees, which include academic affairs, external affairs, finance, rules and regulations and student services.

The class officers' main responsibilities are promoting class unity and fundraising. The social secretary works to coordinate the class balls and the ring dance. The secretary interviews students, not elected into office,

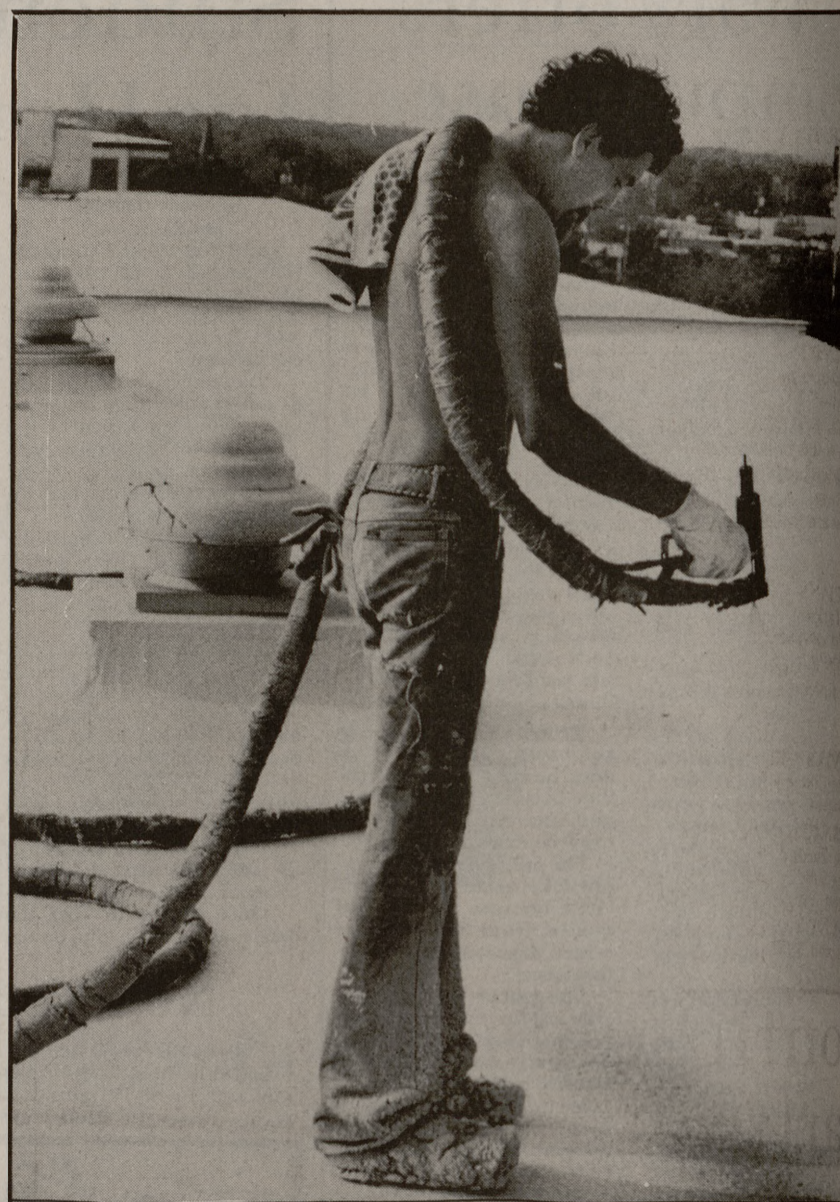
for committee chairman positions. The chairmen aid in the class fundraising and spirit functions and make sure the class' budget is sound. Enough money must remain after the dance to purchase the class' gift to the school.

Senatorial candidates must have 25 constituent signatures when filing and a midterm grade-point ratio of 2.25. The student must maintain a 2.25 GPR, failure to do so will result in removal from office.

Filing will take place in 214 and 214a Pavilion. A fee of \$3 must be paid when filing. The students will receive a handbook that contains election rules and campaigning procedures, guidelines and rules.

Elections will be Monday, Oct. 24. Voting will take place in the Pavilion and the Memorial Student Center.

Run off elections will be Thursday, Oct. 27.
