Overdose of vitamin B6 causes weakness

DALLAS — Diane Caldwell has the strength to trim her fingernails again, a real triumph considering that last winter she was so weak from an apparent overdose of vitamin B6 her husband had to put in her pierced earrings for her.

Caldwell is on a crusade these days to warn the rest of the country about the dangers she and her doctor perceive in the popular vitamin being promoted in megadoses as the ideal, safe way to be thin and healthy.

In August, an article in the New England Journal of Medicine reported that doses of one gram or more per day of B6 could lead to sensory loss.

Caldwell, 33, took at least five times that amount daily from August 1982 until last June. By December she was too weak to

hold a fork, put on her own jewelry or climb a stair without help from husband Kenneth or her friends. She had to close a second office she had opened, and her partners lost thousands of dollars.

She said in an interview she began taking B6 on the advice of a family doctor she won't name. Although extremely healthy, she had occasional problems with water retention and needed to look her best as the owner of a placement service that matches attorneys with law firms.

"I kept asking (the doctor) are you sure this is safe" after she bought a supply of B6 in 1,000 milligram, or one gram, doses from a health food store and started taking five or six grams a day. She said she was reassured there was no problem.

But by December her hands

and feet were tingling, and weakness and paralysis worsened. Having gotten satisfaction from her doctor, she consulted Dr. Malcolm Stewart, a Dallas neurologist who initially diagnosed Guillain-Barre syndrome.

She was put on steroids which led to a 23-pound gain but did little good of wise. They tried another called Imuran, spinal tap, chemotherapy. She did not prove.

"I thought I was going to die," she said with intensity, remembering her terror.

In June she stopped B6 — not because it was a suspicion as the source of condition but because Stewart wanted her off all unnecessary medication.

"I started feeling strange the first time in the middle of August," she said.

A couple of weeks later she heard about the article in the New England Journal.

"There were enough similarities," she said, though there has been documentation," Caldwell said.

"I'm probably 50 to 75 percent recovered," she said, trimmed my own fingernails weeks ago for the first time. "I couldn't spray a deodorant. Stewart has completed notes and records on her and plans to submit his own article to the New England Journal. Until then, he will not comment publicly. Caldwell said she has her full blessing to speak word, however.

"People are literally going to die. I lost a business and I died," she said.

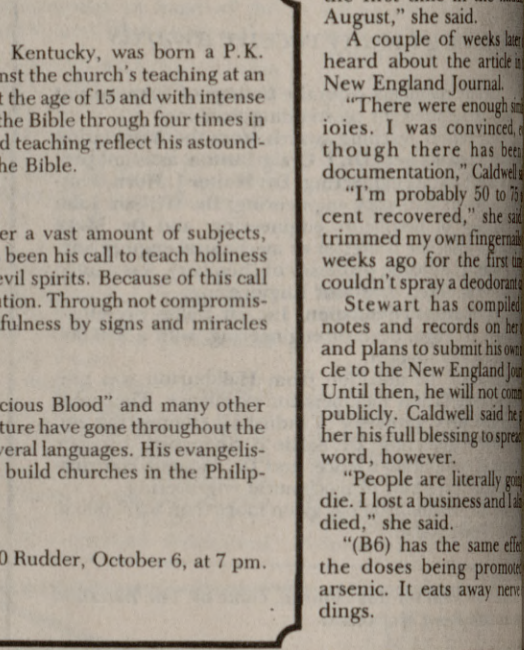
"(B6) has the same effect as the doses being promoted. It eats away nerves and things.
