The contest which is mainly a competition between the dormitories, but for an entry fee of \$15 per team, anyone can enter a five man, five woman team.

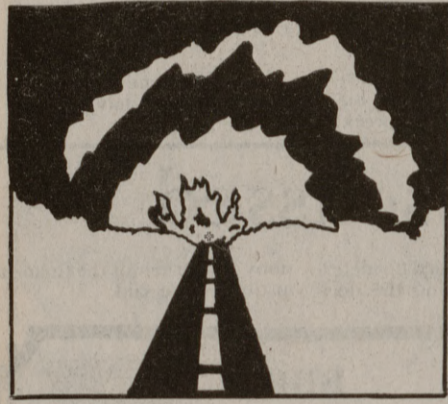

on the drill field with water balloons. The fourth event is fried flipper, a relay race involving an egg and plenty of grace and coordination.

The grand finale, is a complicated relay race combining speed and grace with contestants' yoga-like contortions.

The winner will be the team with the lowest overall score and all team members will receive T-shirts. Sixty teams are expected to compete.

### OTHER:

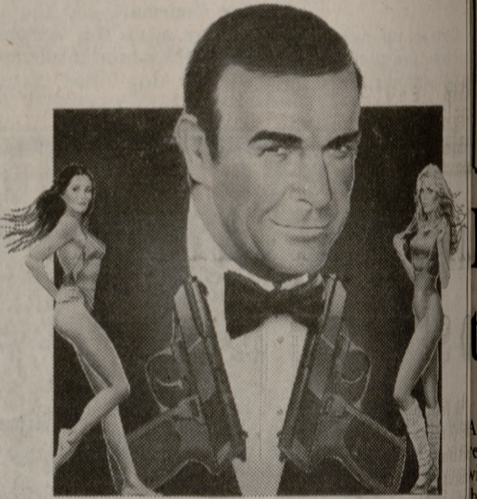
