Any student who fails the written examination (EPE) must satisfy the English Proficiency requirement designated by his/her respective department.

Students in the Departments of Biology, Chemistry, and Mathematics desiring to complete the EPE this semester or who have a conflict with the designated testing date should see Mrs. Radko, Room 152 AAA Building. Students in the Department of Physics should report to the designated location on the day of testing. Juarez mayor to quit, 'through with politics'

JUAREZ, Mexico — The new Juarez City Hall rises six stories high, an imposing building that dominates the landscape as one looks south from El Paso across the Rio Grande.

The mayor who moved the Juarez city government from its cramped, outdated quarters in a rundown section of the border city to the new uptown building has been occupying the municipal government palace only a month.

He is Jose Reyes Estrada, 54, a charismatic politician who says he is bowing out of politics forever next week when his three-year term as mayor ends.

But friends say Reyes Estrada is a natural politician, a man who thrives on the pressure of public office. They predict he'll be serving in some public post before too long.

"No," he insists, swiveling the mayor's chair around to gaze out the window on downtown Juarez. "There's my law office and that's where I'm going. I'm through with politics forever."

Reyes Estrada is a loyal mem-

ber of the Partido Revolucionario Institucional, the Institutional Revolutionary Party. PRI has dominated politics in Mexico the past 54 years.

Next week, however, the new mayor will inherit the PRI-built City Hall. Francisco Barrio Ter-

Reyes Estrada said his decision to leave politics is based on a personal desire to spend more time with his family rather than PRI's loss in municipal elections throughout the state.

razas was voted into office as part of a sweeping victory by the conservative party, Partido Accion Nacional, the National Action Party.

"I'm counting the days," Reyes Estrada said, referring to the change of administration ceremony set for Monday. "There will be no reference to politics from PRI's side. We are merely changing administrations."

Kids' plight investigated

AUSTIN — Gov. Mark White Thursday directed members of a special committee on human services to concentrate their

efforts on improving medical and educational conditions for children.

The Texas Health and Human Services Coordinating

Council was created during last legislative session and charged with improving quality of state human services programs.

White, Lt. Gov. Bill House Speaker Gib Lewis and 20 representatives from governmental agencies and private sector comprise the council.

As part of their initial staff member Dr. Patricia emphasized the need for improving the lot of Texas children, quoting the what she called "alarming" statistics:

- One of every five Texas children lives in poverty.
- The median annual income of Texas female-headed households is half that of all families and the number of such families has quadrupled since 1960.
- About 30,900 Texas children under six must care for themselves while their parents work.
- In 109 Texas counties the infant death rate is higher than national average.
- Nearly a quarter million Texas preschool children not immunized against childhood disease.
