Tiny whale dies in Galveston

GALVESTON — Tootsie, a 400-pound pygmy whale who beached herself near Port Aransas earlier this week, died Thursday at Sea Arama Marine-world, officials said.

Marineworld spokeswoman Sandra Alexander said a veterinarian would examine the 7-foot, 9-inch whale to determine the cause of death. Officials previously said they believed the 400-pound whale suffered from internal parasites that may have damaged the brain and led to the mammal's beaching.

The whale, named Tootsie by Marineworld employees, beached herself near Port Aransas on Monday.

In cathedral's shadow

Catholic cardinal dies

NEW YORK — Cardinal Terence J. Cooke, spiritual leader of nearly 4 million Roman Catholics and American head of the church's anti-abortion battle, died Thursday of leukemia in the shadow of his beloved St. Patrick's Cathedral.

The 62-year-old cardinal, who had been archbishop of New York for 15 years, died 41 days after it was announced he was terminally ill and two days after he suffered a serious setback.

"Terence Cardinal Cooke, tenth bishop, seventh archbishop, fifth cardinal of the See of New York and vicar to military service, Veterans Administration hospitals and government service overseas, completed his work on earth and was called home by Almighty God to heaven this morning, Oct. 6, 1983, at 4:45 a.m.," the Rev. Peter Finn said in a formal announcement.

Finn, spokesman for the Archdiocese of New York, said Cooke "died peacefully in the shadow of his beloved Cathedral of St. Patrick."

Cooke, confined to his official residence behind the cathedral since it was announced Aug. 26 he was terminally ill, was spiritual leader of 1.8 million Catholics in the archdiocese.

As military vicar, Cooke also was in charge of 2.1 million Catholics in the U.S. military in the country and abroad.

Cooke was the American leader of the church's fight against abortion, pressing for legislation to ban the practice and serving for 10 years as chairman of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee for Pro-Life Activities.

A letter from Cooke condemning abortion and mercy killing is scheduled to be read in the archdiocese's churches Sunday.

The archdiocese's Board of Consulators set a meeting to choose an administrator to run the 175-year-old archdiocese until Pope John Paul II picks a successor.

The cardinal's body will lie in repose at the cathedral throughout the weekend, beginning Friday night, Finn said. A funeral mass is set for 2 p.m. Monday, followed by his interment in the archbishops' crypt beneath the main altar.

President Reagan, who considered Cooke a friend and visited the ailing prelate with his wife

Sept. 25, said, "all of America is saddened by the loss of Cardinal Cooke, a saintly man and a spiritual leader."

Reagan said the cardinal "bore his suffering in imitation of his savior."

Pope John Paul II, who announced Cooke's death by announcing his resignation as archbishop attending a synod at the Vatican, said he joined all New Yorkers in praying for the cardinal.

"I thank God for his dedicated ministry and pray that example of his devotion to the church may inspire the faithful for years to come," the pope said.

Mayor Edward Koch ordered city flags flown at half staff in a tribute to Cooke, who died at 5:55 a.m. on Oct. 6. A fire alarm signal reserved for the death of a firefighter in the line of duty was sounded at 5:55 a.m. Monday.

Monsignor Joseph Murphy, chancellor of the archdiocese, was praying at Cooke's bedside when he died, Finn said.

Cooke had received chemotherapy and blood transfusions for eight years for cancer of the lymph system, but his condition became terminal after a recent onset of leukemia.
