Minister accused in wild bus ride

EL PASO—A man accused of hijacking a Greyhound bus with 28 passengers was formerly a minister at the Canaan Baptist Church in Dallas, family members said Wednesday.

Johnny V. Spence Jr., 31, was arrested Tuesday following a wild, 400-mile ride that began about midnight Monday in Tucson, Ariz., and ended Tuesday in Sierra Blanca, a West Texas town 100 miles east of El Paso.

Spence was arraigned in El Paso on charges of kidnapping and interstate transportation of a stolen vehicle.

Tina Spence of Dallas, Spence's mother, said her son was hurrying home to Dallas to visit his father, who had suffered a stroke.

Michael Spence, Spence's brother, said Spence had been having problems and needed help but was never violent.

"It shocked the heck out of me," Michael Spence said when he learned the details of the arrest.

The Spence brother said the accused hijacker recently separated from his wife and was starting a new life in Phoenix.

"Johnny was a minister at the Canaan Baptist Church in Dallas before his marital problems began," Michael Spence said.

Bus driver Ramon Quiroz, 43, of Tucson, said Spence entered the bus in a small town near Tucson carrying two knives with 4- or 5-inch blades. He said that after the bus departed

Spence began prodding him, forcing him to drive up to 90 mph.

Passengers said Quiroz braked the bus suddenly outside Sierra Blanca and threw Spence off balance. Spence then tumbled out of the bus and began running across the desert.

None of the passengers were seriously injured, but three received medical treatment, officials said.

A U. S. Border Patrol helicopter crew spotted Quiroz about a mile from the river, agents said. He was arrested by Hudspeth County Sheriff's deputies.

Passengers recounted the trip as a "night of terror." One passenger said the bus ran through Las Cruces, N. M., at 90 mph "with no cops in sight anywhere."

League fights AIDS research

AUSTIN — An international animal protection group has launched a petition drive to stop the University of Texas from using chimpanzees to study Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome.

AIDS is an often fatal disease that appears most frequently in homosexual men, drug users, blood transfusion recipients and Haitian immigrants.

The International Primate Protection League in Summerville, S.C., has asked UT

to drop the study proposal because the chimpanzee is endangered. The group has distributed 1,200 petitions among its 2,000 members in the United States.

UT spokesman Steve Stuyck said at least four chimpanzees at the UT Science Park in Bastrop would be used, and seven chimpanzees from other research centers also may be used in the research project. The experiment will be used to find a cure for humans with AIDS.
