leachers appropriation of funds for maximizing quality education, Corrigan said.

A primary consideration in funding school districts, Corri-gan said, is that low-income districts don't become isolated money-wise.

"For example," he said, "there is a school district in the San Antonio area that is zoned so that it has no connection with the San Antonio Independent School District. It happens to be a very low-income area with severe funding problems, but it is surrounded by the sufficientlyfunded San Antonio schools.' he said.

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
