FDIC left holding loans

Midland bank opens again

MIDLAND — A federal banking official said the takeover of First National Bank of Midland by Republic Bank Corp. would not cost depositors any money, but it left the government holding more than \$1 billion worth of loans.

Republic Bank Corp. bought the Midland bank's equipment and deposits for \$51.1 million in a bidding process that involved 14 potential buyers, Federal De-

posit Insurance Corp. spokesman Alan Whitney of Washington, D.C., announced.

The bank opened Monday as Republic Bank First National Midland.

Republic Bank administrators have 30 days to decide which of the former bank's \$1.2 billion worth of commercial loans they will acquire from the FDIC, Whitney said.

Whitney said more than half

of the commercial loans were delinquent. All the loans are currently held by the FDIC, which is responsible for collecting the loans not assumed by Republic Bank.

Republic Bank officials say the FDIC will determine what happens to investments some 1,500 shareholders made to 93-year-old FNB.

The FDIC took control of FNB after granting the bank a \$100 million emergency loan to

stabilize it. That loan came from FNB had borrowed more than \$530 million from the Federal Reserve Bank, former FNB officials said.

They have blamed the financial difficulties on bad loans made to the oil and gas industry which suffered a major slump in 1982 with a sharp drop in prices.

Republic Bank acquired another Midland bank in 1982, naming it Republic Bank Midland.

continued from page 1 said, "with a strong background in math, science and English." Another area of concern in the state funding package is the

appropriation of funds for maximizing quality education, Corrigan said.

A primary consideration in funding school districts, Corrigan said, is that low-income districts don't become isolated money-wise.

"For example," he said, "there is a school district in the San Antonio area that is zoned so that it has no connection with the San Antonio Independent School District. It happens to be a very low-income area with severe funding problems, but it is surrounded by the sufficiently-funded San Antonio schools," he said.

"We need to make sure that every child in the state has equal access to a quality education," he said.

In order to do this, the committee is evaluating the total state education revenue package, which constitutes almost half of the state's budget, and its effects on education.

The committee is working to determine the adequacy of current methods of funding and, if necessary, propose and develop alternative methods for future funding to guarantee equal educational spending and opportunities.

State Comptroller Bob Lock, named to the committee, Hobby, is a key member of the panel, Corrigan said, because will certify which funds are available for education.

Corrigan said the committee is studying alternative revenue sources and tax reforms to provide a quality education program. "Funding is very important," he said.
