### **INS** accused of prejudice

Central American refugees testified Wednesday that the Immigration and Naturalization appears voluntarily to request political asylum.

Lisa Brodyaga, an attorney who heads Projecto Libertad in nearby Harlingen, said that since May 25, 1982, the Central Americans have no guarantee that they will not be arrested if Salvadorans and Guatemalans attempt to exercise what she said is a legal right to request asylum.

Brodyaga appeared on the fifth day of trial of a class-action suit seeking to make permanent a 2-year-old temporary injunc-tion which has forced INS officers and border patrolmen to in-form illegal aliens from the two countries that they are entitled to request asylum.

Brodyaga also told U.S. District Judge Ricardo Hinojosa that the INS recommends high-

She said she has filed approxi-Service arrests any refugee who mately 300 applications for asylum over the past three years on behalf of Central Americansall of which were refused and have received negative recom-mendations from INS and State Department officials.

> During the same period the Canadian government has granted 80 percent of all the asylum requests she has filed on behalf of Central American clients, she said.

> The INS and State Department have taken the position that Salvadorans and Guatemalans are "economic refugees" whose requests for political asy-lum are "frivolous" in most cases. The U.S. government requires that each person request-ing asylum prove that he would be subjected to political or religious persecution-not fear of becoming "an innocent victim" of the war in Central America.
