Birds, bees talk not easy

Game teaches sex to kids

LONG BEACH, Calif. — Over and over, Carol Wells heard the same complaints from parents — they wanted to be straightforward with their kids about sexuality and reproduction, but it was easier said than done.

So she decided to make a game of it. Wells, 38, a certified sex therapist and registered nurse, designed a board game, Humanopoly, to be played by families as a relaxed, easy way for children to learn about reproduction.

"One of the things we do is to

use fun and activity when we're uncomfortable with something and that helps bridge the gap," Wells said. "Game playing is a natural part of childhood."

She began to realize the breadth of parents' discomfort with sex topics in her lectures to adult groups about human sexuality.

"The parents wanted to communicate to their children differently than their parents had done with them," she said. "They hadn't gotten much information and they wanted to break that cycle."

"They had the feeling that being open about sexuality would be better than what they had experienced, but it was difficult for them. I'd always suggest books, books, books, but that was uncomfortable, too."

The game idea finally came to her at 4 a.m.

"I had the notion of a sperm and egg traveling along a game board," she recalled. "The sperm and egg are players and they travel through a maze representing the Fallopian tubes."

When players moving through the pink, orange and red maze land on "love" and "fact" spaces, they have to draw a card that asks questions about relationships or reproduction and sexuality.

A player who answers a question correctly wins a chip.

The game ends when the sperm and the egg player meet on the same board space, representing fertilization. Whoever has the most chips when fertilization takes place wins.

The game also comes with a second set of cards and ques-

tions on a more advanced level. It deals with body changes accompany puberty.

"The biology of reproduction is very abstract," Wells said. "Children have to be able to relate it to their own and their parents' bodies and to do that need visualization. That's why there are pictures on the board of male and female bodies of the different stages of pregnancy."

"The main goal of this game is to put sex education in the hands of parents and to create an intimate experience between parents and child about the subject," she said.

She said parents' uneasiness about sexuality leaves their children uninformed and uncomfortable, creating a lack of communication and a mystique

War Powers Act still a source of conflict

WASHINGTON — Despite the bombing deaths of more than 100 Marines in Beirut Sunday, nothing in the War Powers Act or subsequent agreements

requires President Ronald Reagan to go back to Congress to keep U.S. troops in Lebanon.

The law, passed in November 1973 over Richard Nixon's veto, is in the form of a Joint Resolution short but complex enough to be the source of a running debate between Congress and the White House.

Three democratic senators, two of them presidential candidates, said Sunday Reagan is violating the War Powers Act.

"President Reagan should report to Congress under the War Powers Act as he should have done in the first place," said Sen. Alan Cranston, D-Calif.

Another presidential hopeful, Sen. Ernest Hollings, D-S.C., said, "The president is still in violation of the War Powers Act. He should either come to Congress or get out. This deployment of American boys in this type of situation borders on the criminal and is doing us no good at all."

Said Sen. Donald Reagle, D-Mich: "It was a serious error to provide an 18-month authority for U.S. troops to stay in Lebanon. I believe a short deadline—not more than 60 days—must now be established to force a political compromise and bring about the orderly and safe withdrawal of U.S. troops."

The purpose of the War Powers Act, according to its preamble, is "to fulfill the intent of the framers of the Constitution and

ensure that the collective judgment of both the Congress and the president will apply in the introduction of U.S. troops into hostilities and the continuation of use of such troops."

The Lebanon situation and the agreement hammered out last summer, already is defining a hostile situation and Congress has agreed Reagan was in error in sending in the Marines in the first place, Reagan accepted a 1-month limit on the commitment of Marines to a peacekeeping force.

Because of the military actions of the resolution, former Senate aide, Pat Holt said, "A short, nonlegislative moment of the issue is that, given moment, the relations of the president and Congress are what either feed or get away with."

At the moment, Reagan's spokesman made it clear a tragedy such as Sunday's massive loss of life in Beirut hardens his resolve to keep Marines in Lebanon.

"The mission of the United States and the multinational force has not changed," a House spokesman said. "There is no change in our commitment, we are exploring the vulnerability of our troops in Lebanon."
