United Press International LOS ANGELES — An appeals court Sunday threw out an order that blocked CBS from broadcasting duplicates of government videotapes showing the surveillance and arrest of John DeLorean in his cocaine traf-

ficking case. The network said it would air the tapes Sunday night.

Attorneys for the former automaker said they would immediately appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court in hopes of heading off the broadcast. U.S. District Court Judge

Robert Takasugi Saturday issued the order prohibiting CBS and its affiliate, KNXT,

from broadcasting the tapes.

for CBS, said Takasugi had overstepped legal bounds in making his ruling.


