This requirement may be satisfied by (1) passing an examination in English composition (EPE) taken not later than the spring semester of the junior year, or (2) completing English 301 at Texas A&M University with a minimum grade of "C".

Any student who fails the written examination (EPE) must satisfy the English Proficiency requirement designated by his/her respective department.

Students in the Departments of Biology, Chemistry, and Mathematics desiring to complete the EPE this semester or who have a conflict with the designated testing date should see Mrs. Radke, Room 152 AAA Building. Students in the Department of Physics should report to the designated location on the day of testing. Texas A&M has created concern among students about the quality of their educations. The research v. teaching debate is not a new one. But, some professors here seem to think the two areas are indeed balanced.

Dr. John C. Adams, assistant professor of English, says that research and teaching are inter-related.

"It's not an either-or question," Adams said. "There are colleges that devote themselves primarily to teaching and there are research institutions. A University is the whole. It's purpose is to impart and discover knowledge."

Adams, who is currently working on an anthology of Muster speeches, teaches speech communications and thinks research carries over into the classroom.

"To be a good teacher," Adams said, "you have to be actively involved in your field. Research can be used as illustration in the classroom."

Electrical engineering professor John H. Painter says there are dangers in spending too much time in research.

"There's a danger of losing contact with students if you stay out of the classroom too long," Painter said.

Hope to teach jokes at SMU

United Press International DALLAS — Bob Hope, who already has more than 40 honorary doctorates, will teach a five-day seminar on comedy this spring as a visiting professor at Southern Methodist University in Dallas.

The official announcement of Hope's appointment will be made Friday at a news conference prior to a performance that will be taped for use in the comedian's Nov. 23 touring special to air on NBC.

Hope, 80, has a long tradition with the private university dating back to a performance there in the 1930s on the way to a visiting professor at Southern Methodist University in Dallas.

The seminar will be the Bob Hope Comedy School for the comedian. He has donated funds for the theater. Hope broke ground for the theater in 1965, and the facility in October 1967. He had nationally televised performance of the play.

Pat Porter, spokesman for the Meadows School of the Arts at SMU, said Hope will be a distinguished visiting professor with lifetime tenure.

A date has not yet been set for the seminar. Hope's performance will be videotaped for use as teaching aids. The university will stage a series of Hope's movies and work in conjunction with classes.

Hope has not said what he will teach. He said likely topics include comedy, writing, and the history of the comedy in the last 100 years. He has been on television to stage a comedy.
