Texas A&M has created concern among students about the quality of their educations. The research v. teaching debate is not a new one. But, some professors here seem to think the two areas are indeed balanced.

Dr. John C. Adams, assistant professor of English, says that research and teaching are inter-

"It's not an either-or question," Adams said. "There are colleges that devote themselves primarily to teaching and there are research institutions. A University is the whole. It's purpose is to impart and discover knowledge

Adams, who is currently working on an anthology of Muster speeches, teaches speech communications and thinks research carries over into the clas-

'To be a good teacher,' Adams said, "you have to be actively involved in your field. Research can be used as illustration in the classroom.' Electrical engineering profes-

sor John H. Painter says there are dangers in spending too much time in research. There's a danger of losing

contact with students if you stay out of the classroom too long, Painter said.


