

Media reps try out Chrysler's newest

Members of the local media got a chance to be race car drivers for an hour Wednesday when a convoy of 56 Shelby Chargers, new sports cars from Chrysler, passed through town.

Carroll Shelby, race car driver and designer, was present at the rally, which consisted of two tracks: a Solo II track and an Off-Road track.

The Solo II track was a series of S-curves marked off by bright orange buckets.

Bob Caster, a sports writer for The Battalion, took first place in the race with a winning time of 1 minute and .04 seconds.

The second race, on the off-road track, was for four-wheel-drive pick-up trucks.

Eric Evan Lee, photo editor for The Battalion, won with a time of 2 minutes and 31 seconds.

Shelby, who won the 24-hour Le Mans race in 1950, designed the Shelby Cobra when working with Ford Motor Co.

New device checks fluid temperatures

United Press International HIRAM, Ohio — A thermometer that snaps onto pipes and tubing of water heaters, solar collectors and woodstove hot water systems is designed to keep people out of hot water — literally.

The device, made by Condar Co. of Hiram, reads the fluid temperature within a range of 50 to 250 degrees F inside PVC, copper and galvanized pipes. It attaches with spring steel clips and is designed to fit most residential pipe and tubing.

To check the water temperature, you snap the Pipe Temp onto the outlet pipe of the heater, turn on a hot water tap and wait 3 to 4 minutes before reading the thermometer.

Governor asks U.S. storm aid

White said storm damage to homes, vehicles and businesses caused a hardship for residents of the West Texas county.

The Small Business Administration will evaluate damage reports and determine the amount of long term, low interest loans that can be offered to Lubbock area residents.

White said about 130 homes were damaged in the Oct. 19 storm, which also inflicted heavy losses on area farmers.
