

Kennedy Memorial Lacking enthusiasm

DALLAS — Sponsors of a 22 memorial for former president John F. Kennedy recently are having trouble relating widespread interest in the event which will mark the anniversary of his assassination.

Dallas County Democrats, however, said the event will be a success, despite the fact that few national dignitaries they might have confirmed they will attend.

The program will include speeches, prayers and readings by Kennedy, who was slain in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963.

Among those invited were President Ronald Reagan; vice president George Bush; the en-

tire Congress; members of Kennedy's Cabinet; former Texas Gov. John Connally; Kennedy's wife, Jacqueline Onassis; his brother, Sen. Edward Kennedy; and Pope John Paul II.

As of last week, Reagan had not responded. Bush, Connally, Onassis, Kennedy and the Pope had declined. No Cabinet members had accepted and only a handful of congressmen had agreed to attend.

Democratic presidential candidates Walter Mondale, John Glenn and Reubin Askew have expressed interest in attending, but neither have confirmed.

As of Wednesday, only 117 of 2,000 tickets to a luncheon had been sold, but Bob Greenberg, chairman of the Dallas County

Democratic Party, said the pace should pick up as the event nears.

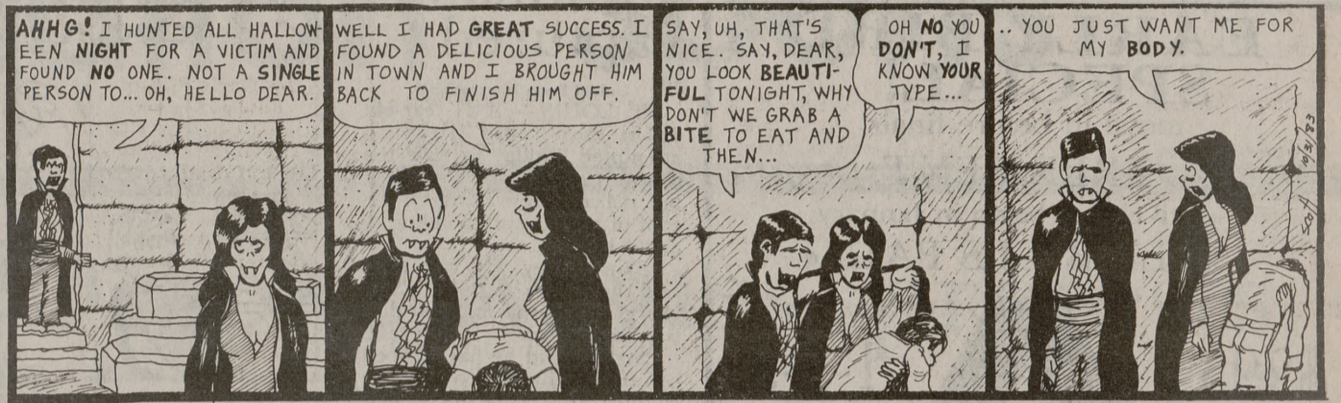
Frank Hernandez, a Dallas lawyer who heads the planning committee, said the Democrats had hoped to get former first lady Lady Bird Johnson, U.S. House Speaker Thomas P. "Tip" O'Neill and Rep. Steve Bartlett, R-Texas, to speak at the memorial services.

Johnson has said she could not be in Dallas on that date, but Hernandez said there was still a possibility she might attend. O'Neill has given no firm commitment, Democratic officials said.

The county historical commission has also planned to unveil a model of the proposed Kennedy museum, which is scheduled for completion in 1985. The museum will be located on the sixth floor of the old Texas School Book Depository building where it is believed Lee Harvey Oswald fired the fatal shots.
