UH's Landry says offense can move on Horns

HOUSTON — Freshman quarterback Gerald Landry Tuesday said he believes the Houston Cougars can move the football on Texas Saturday despite the Longhorns ability to stop seven prior opponents.

"I think the turnover problems are behind us. You can't worry about that. We can win if we execute and move the ball like we're capable of." — Houston quarterback Gerald Landry on the Coogs chances against Texas Saturday.

Landry, who will start his second game Saturday, watched coaches films of last year's 50-0 Texas win over Houston on Tuesday and said he planned a steady diet the rest of the week of films showing the Longhorns defense stopping opponents' offenses.

"Defense," he said, "seems to

be their strength. But I really think we will be able to move the ball on them. Our team is real confident after the TCU game."
The Longhorns bring to the Astrodome the No. 1 rated defense in the country. That unit has allowed 193 yards a game, a figure that Landry said impressed him.

"But we're not just going to lay

down just because they are the number one defense," he said.

Landry last Saturday became the first freshman who coach Bill Yeoman ever started by choice, and he justified Yeoman's confidence by leading the struggling team to a 28-21 win over Texas Christian.

"It really was a good feeling," Landry said. "I was real confident in my teammates and staff. And we executed pretty well."

Since his first exposure in the Baylor game, Landry has learned to read the defensive ends' movements during execution of the veer option offense. Against Texas, the smallish Landry will come face-to-face with 6-5, 243 Eric Holle and 6-4, 240 Ed Williams.

TCU more often than not forced Landry to carry the ball on the option. He did without reservation, carrying 29 times for 133 yards and two touchdowns.

"Texas will be tougher, we know that," Landry said.

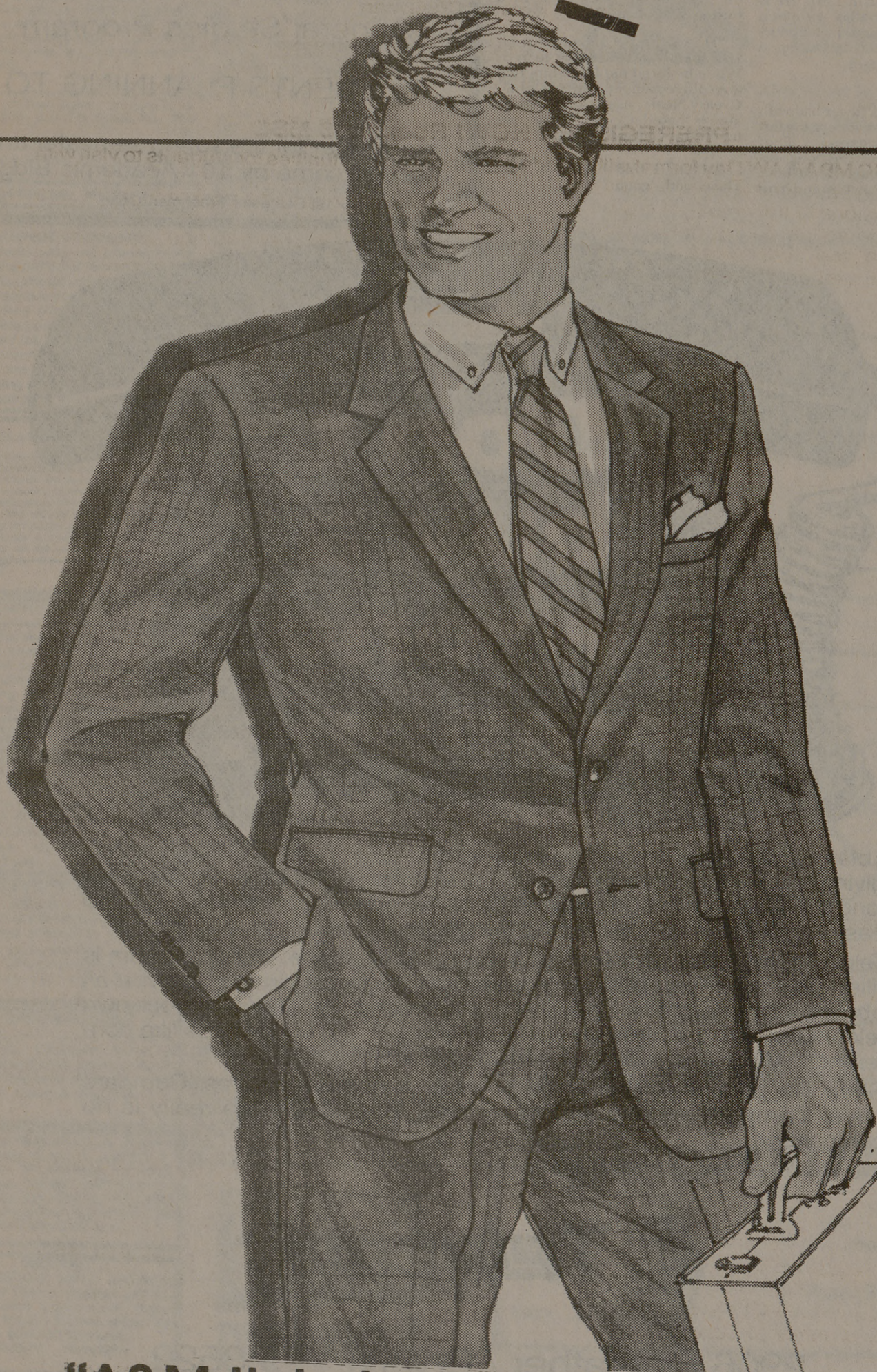
