

Investigators try to determine cause of fatal fair accident

DALLAS — Investigators have carefully begun dismantling a midway ride at Fair Park and combing through its individual gears to determine the cause of last month's fatal accident at the State Fair of Texas.

The Enterprise remained intact with only visual inspections permitted until Saturday, when dozens of investigators, federal safety officials, and lawyers gathered to document the dismantlement.

Workers for Continental Park Attractions, the New York company that owns the ride, slowly began removing the ride's gondolas as investigators photographed, diagrammed and measured tiny parts of the ride's structure.

One of the Enterprise's gondolas ripped off the high speed ride Oct. 17, killing one of its

passengers, 19-year-old William Wade Phillips, and injuring 16 bystanders as it skidded 40 feet along the midway.

Fred Stradley, a Dallas lawyer said Saturday that weeks of tests, metal analyses and engineering studies must be completed before a cause of the accident will be determined.

The breakdown of the ride is continuing slowly as representatives from the State Fair, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, the ride's manufacturer, and the people injured in the accident watch and approve each step of the procedure.

Searchers comb Gulf

Lawyer still missing

NEW ORLEANS - A Coast Guard cutter, a helicopter, and divers from the New Orleans police department searched Sunday for a Mississippi attorney missing from a seaplane that crashed Friday in murky Gulf waters during a fishing trip.

The pilot of the Cessna seaplane and two other passengers, all from Mississippi, swam to safety after the craft went down in 12 feet of water near Free Mason Island off the Louisiana coast.

Their companion, Hattiesburg lawyer Bill Porter, is still missing.

A Coast Guard spokesman said searchers were combing the area around the crash site, trying to detect a sign of Porter or the sunken seaplane.

"If we could find the wreckage, divers from the New Orleans Police Department probably would dive on it," the spokesman said.

Although the plane crashed and sank in about 12 feet of water, he said, searchers have been unable to locate the wreckage because the murky water.

Pilot Russell Fagen of Hattiesburg, Nolan Hill of Hattiesburg, and Bud Holmes, an attorney for Forest and counties in Mississippi, were to safety on Free Mason Island after the crash.

The three survivors reached the crash scene later after the plane went down but were unable to find their companion, Hill said.

"We want to be a part of the solution, not the problem," said Dalager. The first responding officer said. How he handles the situation can produce either good or bad results. Whatever he does must not provoke violence. He should get out of the line of fire and wait for help. If there's no more violence, the situation's first 45 minutes are no more critical. In a hostage situation, bank hold-up with 30 people inside, Dalager said the course will emphasize four phases. First, there is the reaction. The police arrive to decide what to do and how. All adjacent buildings are cleared out, especially those with the people standing watching the charade.

Second is the containment phase. Efforts are made to contain the situation in as small an area as possible. All phone lines in the bank are verified. A side communication channel is established.

Third is the negotiation phase. If nothing can be worked out with the offender, it won't give in, it's on to the four — relocation.

This might be an attempt to get the robber out of a bank as few hostages as possible. Officers try to control the situation by supplying a means of escape, either by the police, not the robber or his outside accomplice. This way, how far he'll go when he'll stop can be controlled.

Another part of the course will teach how to instruct the media in these situations.

"We organize the media beforehand," Dalager said. "We become a part of the operation. We brief them on what's going on and how we're going to handle the situation."

The course is futuristic, Dalager said. Texas is second in California in its growth. With the possibility of the relocation of Texas reaching a million between 1995 and 2000, there's going to be a lot of increase in violence, he said.

"We've got to stop being about violence," Dalager said. "We're the most violent in the world."

Reagan honors dead soldiers

WASHINGTON — President Reagan said Saturday that the soldiers serving in Lebanon and Grenada are America's "heroes" and should be honored alongside the veterans of World War II, Korea and Vietnam.
Reagan visited Camp Lejeune, N.C., Friday to attend memorial services for soldiers killed in Lebanon and Grenada and visit with soldiers who were in those actions.
"Our most recent heroes are those still serving and those who have just come back from Lebanon and Grenada, carried with the same dedication and valor of their colleagues in the past," he said.
Reagan said America should remember on Veterans Day, Nov. 11, all those who served in the U.S. military, especially those killed in Lebanon and Grenada.
"When you see one of our young men or women on the street, how many of them smiling 'hello' and 'thank you,'" he said, "have suffered the scars of
