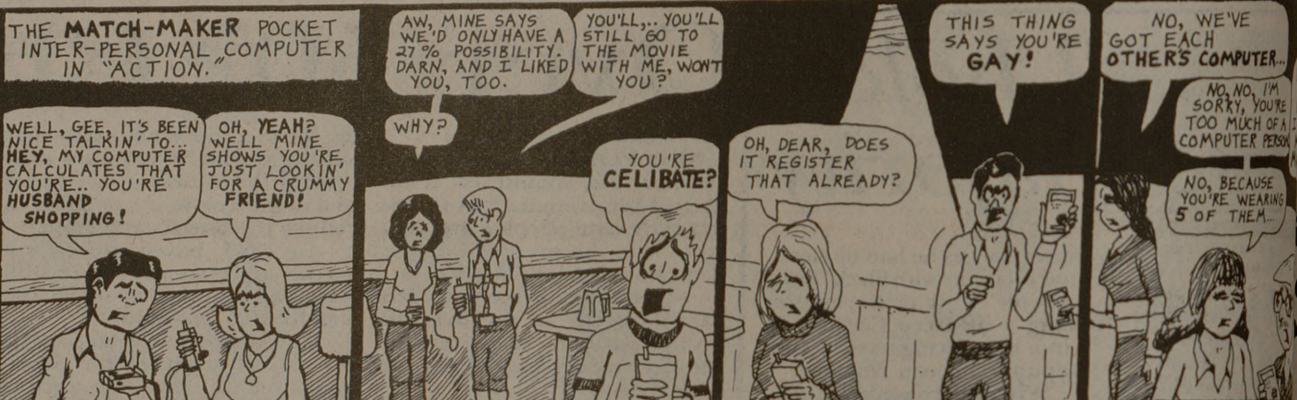

Mother dead, father disappears Child with AIDS needs home

United Press International MIAMI — Nearly 30 people responded to a public plea and offered to take in a homeless 14-month-old girl suffering from Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) who has no more than three years to live, health officials said Wednesday.
