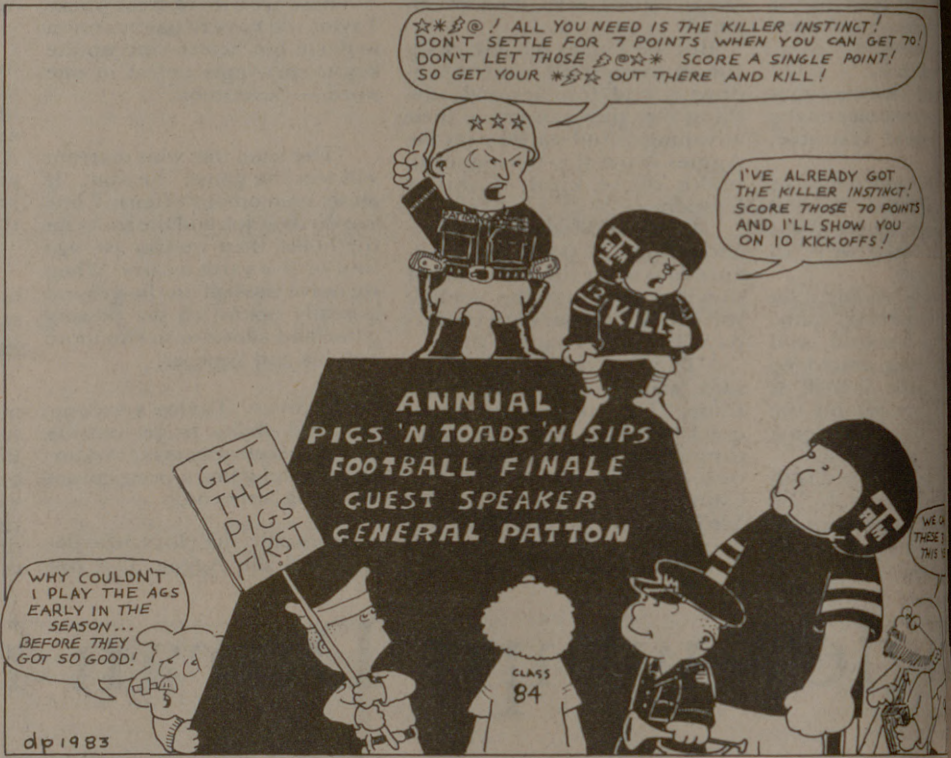
man, junior, freshman, sophomore, sophomore, sophomore, junior, freshman, sophomore, sophomore...I wonder how the fishing is in the winter?"

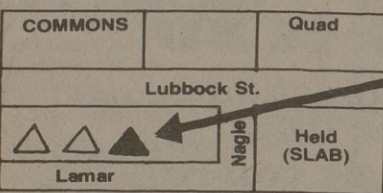
