Terri Reek, co-chairman of Songfest, says the organization made \$3,000 last year and expects to take in about \$4,000 this year. All profits will go to the Brazos Rehabilitation Center.

In an effort to make the show more professional, auditions were held this year.

"We decided to have them because the length of the performance in the past was two and a half plus hours and we wanted to cut it down," Reek said.

Better organization of the groups also prompted the auditions.

Of the 12 acts that auditioned, 10 made it, she said, but the two that won't be in Songfest dropped out on their own. Each group will be judged on the quality of its singing and dancing.

"This year it was only sororities and fraternities who entered," Reek said, "but it is open to everyone."

Mary McNair, who works

with promotions for Chi Omega, said she hopes other than sororities and fraternities, such as dorms, the Corps of Cadets, will be involved in the future.

"We promote it as Songfest," she said. "We call it 'Chi Omega Songfest.'" With "Razzle Dazzle" theme, Songfest acts as "Jeepers Creepers" to "made" to "Arthur's Tale" to "If I Were Not An Soldier."

Reek, a senior major from New Conn., said with 10 and closing number Chi Omega sorority non-judged acts in the year's show should last two hours.




