

Childress gives TCU headaches

After a spectacular 17-tackle, four-sack game against Arkansas last week, Saturday's nine-tackle, two-sack effort against TCU may seem like a sub-par

performance for Texas A&M defensive end Ray Childress. But Horned Frog right tackle Jim Benson, who did his best against Childress for four quarters, thought differently. Benson had a difficult time

fielding questions from reporters after the game, but the 6-5, 260-pound Benson did say, "I've got a splitting headache right now so I'm not thinking too well."

It seems that even when Childress doesn't have the dominating statistics, he makes life miserable for his opposition.

"It's not easy to play for 60 minutes against Ray," A&M head coach Jackie Sherrill said last week.

Childress' nine tackles (five unassisted) against TCU pushed his total to 103 for the season — tops among Aggie defenders.

Those kind of impressive numbers apparently justify his being called a potential all-American by Sherrill and the media. In fact, Childress has

already been named to one all-American team. The Turner Broadcasting Systems network named the 6-6, 271-pound junior from Richardson to its all-American team last week.

TCU quarterback Anthony Sciaraffa evaluated Childress more mildly, "He's definitely one of the better players in the conference," he said.

Sciaraffa said the Frogs hadn't prepared any differently for Childress or the Aggies, but added that Childress' presence perhaps had an influence on the TCU game plan.

But TCU coach Jim Wacker also said that Childress hadn't bothered the Frogs preparation.

"He wasn't a factor in the game plan," Wacker said, "we just ran our basic offense (the veer), but he's one heckuva ball player."

Childress also drew high praise from A&M defensive coordinator R.C. Slocum.

"When you get a man as big as he is and as strong as he is, he can be just devastating," Slocum said.

"We feel bad every week," Slocum said, "because when we go to grade the film and pick a player of the week, we know that son of a gun deserves it every week. But we can't give it to him every time."

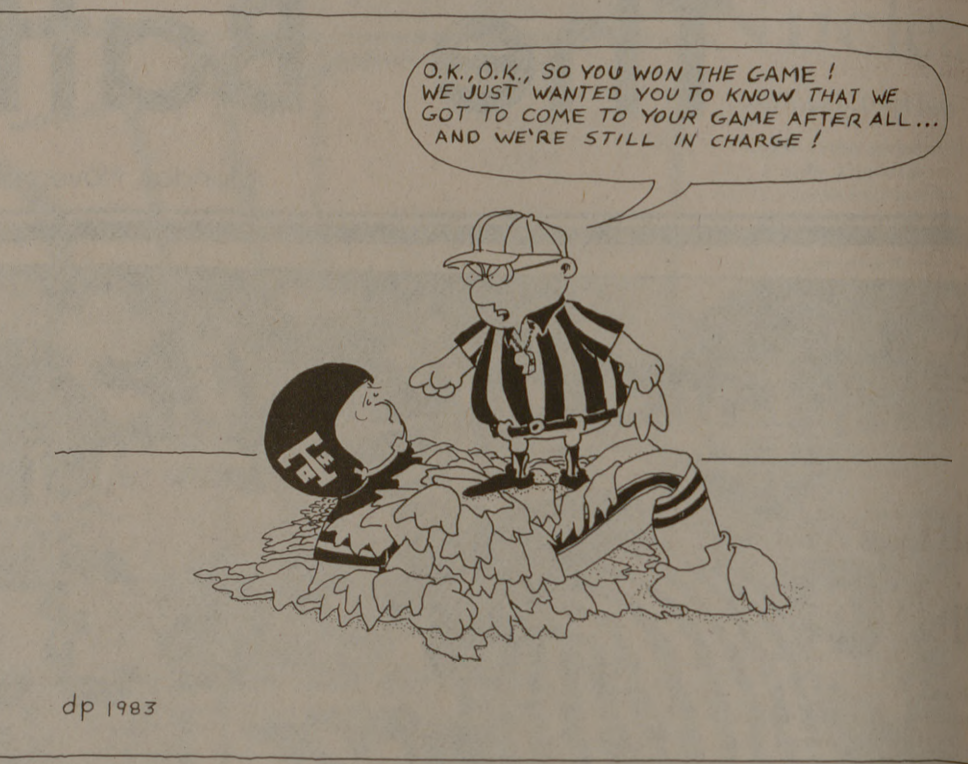

Results Co-ed Razorbacks outswim Aggies Women's basketball wins opener

After jumping out to an early lead, the host Arkansas Razorbacks held on to capture first place in the Arkansas Co-Ed Relays Saturday in Fayetteville, Ark.

The Razorbacks compiled 49 points to clinch first, 22 points better than second place Texas A&M. Nebraska was third with 19 1/2, followed by Kansas, Texas Tech and Oklahoma.

The meet consisted of 11 relay events and two diving events, with each school entering one co-ed team. The Aggies scored points in nine of the 11 events, winning the 400-yard backstroke and the 400-yard medley relay.

After taking a two-hour break, both the A&M men's and women's teams competed in a dual meet with Arkansas, winning the women's meet but losing the men's.

In the men's portion of the meet, the Razorbacks swept the Aggies, 73-40 to drop the A&M men to 1-2 on the year. Individual winners for the Aggies came from the 400-yard freestyle relay team, sophomore Chris O'Neil's first place in the 200-yard butterfly and freshman Scott McDonald's wins in both the 200-yard individual medley and the 200-yard backstroke.

The women captured their third dual meet victory of the year without a loss, 57-56, by win-

ning the 200-yard freestyle relay, the last event of the meet. In addition to the 200-yard freestyle relay win, other firsts came from the 200-yard medley team, Edlyn Bell in the 200-yard backstroke and Eileen Doull in the 100-yard freestyle.

Both teams will travel to State College, Penn. Dec. 2 for the Penn State Relays.

Women's Basketball
The women's basketball team opened its season Friday with a 91-65 defeat of Hardin Simmons University in Abilene. The Aggies were paced by Lisa Langston's 16 points.

That one-game win streak was stopped Saturday, however, as the Aggies fell to the Wayland Baptist Flying Queens in Plainview, 80-74. Leading scorer for A&M was Jenni Edgar with 23 points. The Aggies play North Texas State in Denton Tuesday, before their home opener Nov. 23 against St. Mary's.

Volleyball
The Aggies will be battling for an at-large bid to the NCAA national tournament this weekend when they travel to Baton Rouge, La., for the LSU Invitational. A&M lost a shot at the SWC championship and an automatic bid in the NCAA Wednesday when they lost to Texas, 15-8, 15-12, 15-10.

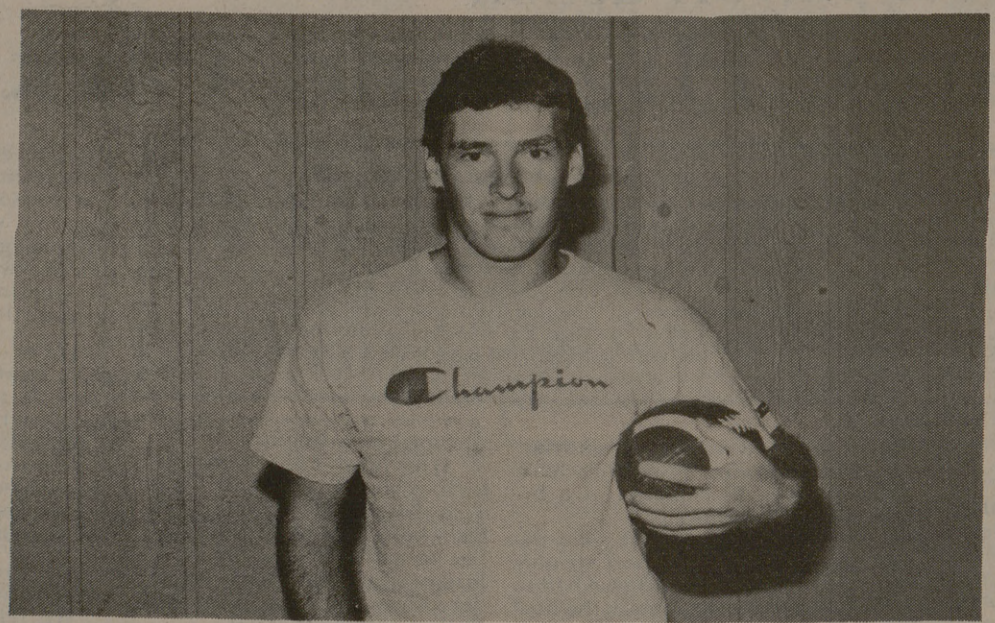
