Mobile, Ala. disallows waste burning in port

MOBILE, Ala. — The Mobile City Commission passed a resolution Tuesday opposing plans to allow Vulcanus I and Vulcanus II — two ships that burn hazardous waste — to operate from the Port of Mobile.

The action came before an Environmental Protection Agency public hearing on the matter Tuesday night. Mobile Finance Commissioner Gary Greenough said the resolution would be given to EPA officials. "We are adopting a resolu-

tion today taking the position that we are opposed to the operation of that particular vessel in the harbor of Mobile and any other vessel like that," said Greenough.

Chemical Waste Management Inc., of Oak Brook, Ill., wants to use the ships to take hazardous wastes far into the Gulf of Mexico for incineration. The firm also operates the largest hazardous waste dump in the United States at Emelle in west Alabama.

Woman gets two years for aggravated perjury

BROWNWOOD — A woman authorities sought for months has pleaded guilty to aggravated perjury and has been sentenced to two years in prison for providing false information to a Brown County grand jury.

Betty Jo Glendinning, 59, waived her right to a trial during a pretrial hearing Monday, ending a pattern of what she called working as a professional victim because she could not get a job.

"I just wanted to eat," she said after pleading guilty. "It takes an act of Congress to get a job once a person is not young anymore."

Glendinning had told Brownwood authorities last year she knew who was involved in the 1981 slaying of Donna Inlow, 83, found stabbed to death in her shoe store.

Brownwood police reported Glendinning had a history of going into sheriff and police offices and saying she had information about one of their unsolved crimes.

She would come to authorities with a bloody mouth and say she

had been robbed before she volunteered information about an unsolved case, Brown County Deputy Hayes Beam reported.

Glendinning's information to the Brown County grand jury prompted the arrest of a Shreveport, La., businessman, but he later was released because officials could not verify the information Glendinning gave.

She disappeared after the testimony, prompting authorities to issue a warrant for her.
