Freshman guard Todd Holloway scored 23 points and handed out seven assists to lead the Texas Aggies to an 89-58 victory over Prairie View A&M Tues-day in G. Rollie White Coliseum.

Holloway, who also had six steals, hit 7 of 12 shots from the field and 9 of 9 from the free throw line to push the Aggies to their second win of the season against no losses. Prairie View dropped to 0-3.

The Aggies, who opened the season Saturday with a win over Texas Lutheran College, pulled away from the Panthers early in the contest and were never seriously contested. 


