

> The indictment resulted from a 10-month investigation on infant deaths in the pediatric intensive care unit at Medical Center Hospital, where Jones was employed.

District Judge Pat Priest sche-duled Jones' trial for Feb. 27.

At Jones' request, Priest ordered that she be returned to the Williamson County Jail in Georgetown, where she is scheduled to go on trial for murder Jan. 9 for the death of 15-month-old Chelsea Ann McClel-

Trade zones set at Mexico border United Press International WASHINGTON — Four

areas along the financially be-leaguered U.S.-Mexican border weston, El Paso, Dallas-Fort Worth, San Antonio and Harris County. There are 97 foreign trade zones nationwide.

A foreign trade zone is an area outside U.S. Customs Service territory where importers or manufacturers may bring in goods exempt from Customs duties until they are officially imported into the United States. The goods also may be exported

Eagle Pass was granted a zone adjacent to the Eagle Pass Cus-toms port of entry. The zone in-cludes five sites totaling 1,380 acres, including 1,100 acres at the Maverick County Airport, and will be operated by the non-profit Maverick County Development Corp. Prospective uses include warehousingdistribution, and the processing of construction materials and apparel.

The non-profit Starr County Industrial Foundation will operate a 42-acre zone on three Starr County sites near the Rio Grande City and Roma Customs ports of entry. Planned uses include warehousing-distribution of machinery and equipment, and liquor.

Del Rio will establish a 422acre zone on four separate Val Verde County sites near the Del Rio Customs port of entry. The largest site is 220 acres within the Del Rio International Airport. The zone will be used for warehousing and distribution of ap-"The president's task force on house slippers.
