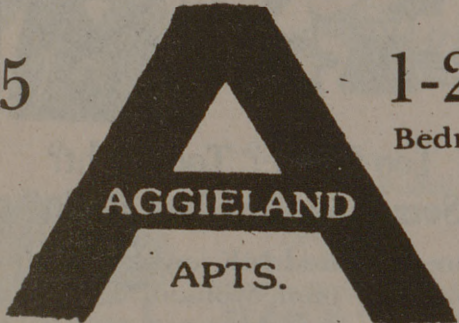

Historic homes altered

United Press International LUBBOCK — Most of the historical homes on the range west Texas have been altered or altered with aluminum siding and other modifications since they were built in the 1900s, a Texas Tech research team says.

The team traveled more than 20,000 miles last summer through 48 High Plains counties while conducting a historical survey of architecture.

Project manager Joseph King said Thursday 828 sites were reported to the Texas Historical Commission as worthy of national study. King directs a search for the Center of History of Engineering and Technology at Texas Tech.

Towns with sites selected for further study of the architecture of homes or commercial buildings included Canadian, Cleburn, Pampa, Shamrock and Dalhart.

Donald Abbe, research associate for the project, said many sites deserving more study were found in smaller communities and towns scattered across Texas instead of on famous ranches.

"Chances of finding an altered building are better in urban areas," Abbe said. "Old rural houses were more likely to be abandoned to go to ruin than were urban houses."

King said the survey emphasized rural towns of less than 10,000 residents and selected older sections of cities with more than 10,000 residents.

"I think the survey has shown that even in an area as young as the High Plains, a lot can be learned from the buildings, residences and other structures," King said.

There is a heritage there that should not be ignored which still exists, he said. The High Plains towns were durable compared to western mining camps of the same era. The mining camps were functional, but built for future generations, said.

The survey was funded by a \$41,600 grant from the National Park Service through the Texas Historical Commission.

Commission architect historian Kenneth Breich said the commission would use information to evaluate the historical significance of structures and to determine what architectural study might be needed.

Prisoner wins move from pen

United Press International LEAVENWORTH, Kan. — A 41-year-old convicted killer who held a female employee hostage was transferred from the federal penitentiary to another institution, spokesman said Thursday.

The knife-wielding inmate demanded a transfer to another prison while holding the woman hostage for two hours Wednesday in the penitentiary's records office. The woman was released unharmed.

Prison spokesman Mark Trelle would not reveal whether inmate has been transferred. He also would not release the name of the inmate or the hostess.

Luttrell said the woman was freed after a three-member negotiating team convinced him there would be no reprisals for his actions.

Luttrell said the inmate served six years of a 30-year sentence stemming from a conviction in Texas. He said the incident took place after the inmate had been sent to the hospital.
