Tower climber faces jail, \$1,000 fine for his stunt

United Press International RICHMOND — A window washer and would-be stuntman faced 180 days in jail and a \$1,000 fine Monday for climbing a 1,900-foot guywire attached to a huge broadcasting tower.

David L. Adcock, 21, of Katy, who goes by the name Skip Stanley and uses the nickname "Blue Bandit," also faced a threatened criminal lawsuit by the owners of the tower.

Adcock posted \$1,000 bond and was freed after spending the night in jail.

Justice of the Peace Robert Stahl set Dec. 15 as a hearing date on a criminal trespass charge filed by Fort Bend County officials. The charge is a misdemeanor.

Adcock scaled a 4-inch diameter guywire on Sunday to

make the daring climb, his second such stunt in the Houston area in seven months. Previously, he climbed 68 stories on the face of the 71-story Allied Bank Plaza and then parachuted off in downtown.

He was charged in the latest incident after jumping off the broadcasting tower in the Fort Bend County town of Missouri City and riding a parachute to safety.

He landed in a resident's yard and was taken in by the couple who lived there. That couple then thwarted Fort Bend County

deputies' attempts to take him for two hours.

Adcock's friends sold his heralding the stunt, which attracted a crowd of about 100 people to the Houston area. After the climb, Adcock was taken to a hospital for possible bond.

KTXH-TV contemplated a lawsuit, saying it had to take down its broadcasting post. Adcock would not be prosecuted.

During the climb, Adcock told his brother by radio, "I'm scared. I'm scared."

DPS spokeswoman Sgt. Dominguez said. Up to 600 people had been evacuated by 10 p.m., authorities said, and witnesses reported a steady stream of cars leaving the area.

Dominguez said several containers containing volatile, toxic liquids such as jet fuel, insecticides, kerosene and antifreeze were ablaze, and other witnesses reported high winds carried in by a front wind-whipped the fire tank to tank and warehouse.

At least six houses were ablaze. "There are gigantic orange balls of fire hopping from tank to tank. Each time the fire tank, it just blows it straight into the air," said KTRH reporter Chris Hansen. "It is turning clouds in area bright orange."

Witnesses a few blocks from the blaze reported they could feel explosions every few minutes and could feel the heat from the blaze.

More than 100 firefighters were on the scene trying to keep it from spreading. The fire caused a power outage to the area, and phone service was spotty.

Officials said fire fighters were spraying cold water tanks of volatile chemicals to prevent further explosions. Cause of the initial explosion had not been determined.

Law enforcement agencies set up a command post at the lands Elementary school about a mile from the plant, and reporters were not allowed beyond that point.
