Leader of Mafia in prison

LOS ANGELES — Joseph "Joe Bananas" Bonanno, who reigned as a Mafia kingpin for 30 years without going to jail, was confined Tuesday to the hospital ward of a federal penitentiary where he began serving his first prison term.
 Bonanno, 78, surrendered at Terminal Island federal prison Monday to imposed the one-year sentence, in part on a 1980 conviction for conspiracy to obstruct justice.

In an hour-long plea for leniency before sentencing last January, defense attorney Albert Krieger said Bonanno suffered from cancer and heart trouble and his wife recently died "as a direct result of Mr. Bonanno's conviction."
 Bonanno was originally ordered to serve five years in prison but a judge reduced the penalty to one year. Bonanno's attorney, Alfred Donau III, predicted his client would serve six or seven months in prison.

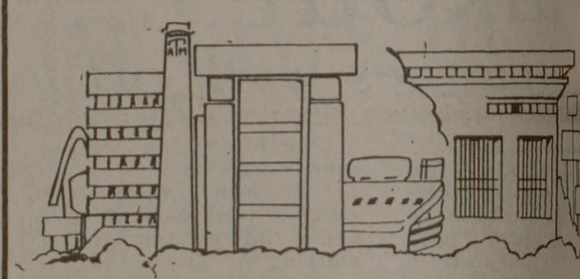
Bonanno, a Sicilian immigrant who went from bootlegger and gunman for Al Capone to the top of American Mafia leadership, was found guilty by a federal judge in San Francisco of interfering with a grand jury investigation.

Bonanno was known as "Joe Bananas" when he led one of the five New York crime "families" in the 1960s.

His reign as a mob overlord was believed to have lasted until his 1964 "kidnap" by gunmen in front of his Park Avenue apartment, one day before he was scheduled to testify on Mafia operations before a New York grand jury.

He went into hiding for 19 months, emerging in May 1966 to surrender at a federal courthouse in New York. He never explained his absence.

Astronauts cleared for extra orbit day

SPACE CENTER, Houston — The shuttle Columbia, shaking and groaning from hours of baking in the sun at 214 degrees, was cleared Tuesday for a bonus 10th day in orbit with landing now set for Thursday morning in California.
 Scientist-astronauts Owen Garriott, Robert Parker, Wilf

Merbold and Byron Lichtenberg took advantage of the extra day added to the mission by conducting a variety of experiments when they normally would have been stowing away equipment.
 Scientists at mission control, their excitement growing as more data streams down from Spacelab, reported additional findings as Columbia passed the eight-day shuttle endurance record it set in 1982.

Rudolph von Baumgarten, of Gutenberg University in Mainz, West Germany, said results from his inner ear experiment will force doctors to rewrite textbooks. He said tests on Merbold showed that a vestibular response theory dating back to 1906 is no longer valid.
 Italian scientist Luigi Napolitano was so happy with Merbold's operation of a fluid physics experiment that he called the West German astronaut "a great guy, a great scientist, a great experimenter, a great astronaut, and a great European."

Mission commander John Young and co-pilot Brewster Shaw were in Columbia's cabin when Guy Gardner in mission control reported that officials had confirmed the weekend's decision to bypass original Wednesday landing and have Columbia in orbit 10:58 a.m. EST Thursday wards Air Force Base.

"The weather at Edwards looking good for both Thursday and Friday," Gardner said. "Terrific!" exclaimed Gardner who has been in space before.
 As it turned out, the shuttle at the Mojave Desert airfield was expected to land Wednesday, meaning the astronauts probably would have to extend their mission to Columbia's 23rd day in orbit. Tuesday. This was part of a series of tests to see if a 23-foot-long Spacelab 18-foot tunnel linking Columbia's cabin to the high temperature.

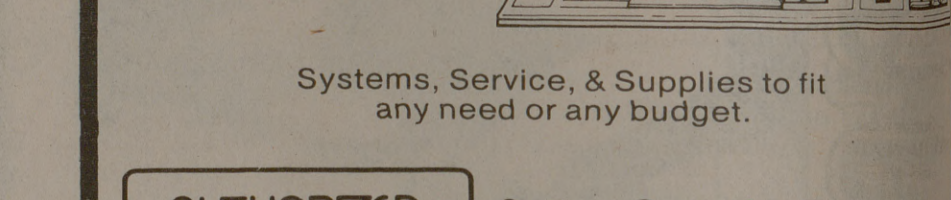
The ship's orbit is kept in sunlight to maintain the rest of the flight. Now Columbia changes position relation to the sun to keep from building up in orbit. "Kind of like a ship would in heavy seas."
