Deputies talk about confession

BOSSIER CITY, La. — Deputies were conferring Thursday on the results of an interview with confessed mass killer Henry Lee Lucas about the death of an unidentified girl whose body was found along a northwest Louisiana highway.
Detective Sgt. Bobby Thorne talked to Lucas Wednesday while 40 law enforcement officers from four states gathered in Austin to pool evidence on Lucas and unsolved slayings in their areas.

"I can't say if any charges will be filed, because I need to sit down and talk to the investigator first," said Bossier Parish Capt. Lamar Breedlove.

Thorne met with Breedlove late Thursday to discuss the talk with Lucas and whether to file charges against him in the slaying of "Jane Doe," whose decomposed body was found in January 1981 by a man walking along Louisiana 157 in northeast Bossier Parish.

The woman's body remains unclaimed in the parish morgue. She was stabbed to death and a kitchen knife was found plunged into the ground near her body.

Lucas has admitted killing more than 150 people in 17 states. He has been formally charged in a dozen murders, including the slaying of a North-east Louisiana University co-ed.

Information netted at the Austin meeting has linked Lucas to 30 more killings and eliminated him as a suspect in nine other deaths, said Texas Department of Public Safety Director Jim Adams. He said 35 murders in 23 states were "cleared" by Lucas' confessions before the conference began.

Lucas, 47, has admitted killing his victims during travels through various states. He has been sentenced to life in prison for the stabbing death of his 15-year-old common law wife, and to 75 years for the slaying of an elderly Texas woman.

Lucas' third murder trial is scheduled for Jan. 16 in Georgetown.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — Christmas shoppers in Memphis, Dallas and Little Rock can not only buy computers this year, they can use a department store's special computer system to pick the right gifts for friends and relatives.

"The whole program is to show consumers they don't need to be intimidated by computers," said Roberta Nedry, a representative for the Epson computer firm.

Shoppers use the system by telling the computer what type person they are shopping for and giving the sex, age and lifestyle plus the price range for the gifts they want to buy.

"We had a little old man who came in yesterday. He was really afraid of using the computer," Ms. Nedry said. "He said he was intimidated."

The computer is set up to work like a typewriter, however, and soon he was pecking away at the keyboard and working the system like a pro.

Shoppers just have to sit down and type in the answers to the list of simple questions and then wait for a printout of the suggested items from a master list of several hundred products.

Richard and Susan Hiller stopped by for a demonstration,

giggling that they knew all about how to use a computer just a few seconds, however.

Memphis couple was even punching in the information. Another shopper, looking for a gift for his 60-year-old father, the computer came up with a list of suggested presents that included dress shirts and a shave lotion.

Depending on the category gift and the price range, the computer will provide a list of one to a dozen products.

Just for fun, Nedry typed a program looking for gifts for President Reagan.

With an unlimited price range, the computer can suggest several suggestions of electronic equipment. But the interesting item was a set of sheets for the presidential room.

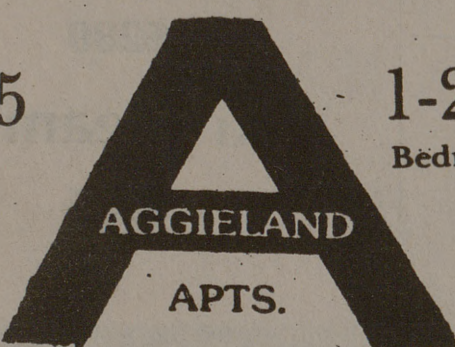
