The United Way allocates its money quarterly to the organizations it supports, so the final allocation of the money from this drive won't be until October 1984. Fleischer said this gives them plenty of time to reach the goal or to make adjustments.

But Fleischer said he won't be disgruntled if the goal isn't reached because of the large increase his organization has experienced in the past few years — 30 percent last year and 17 percent both years before that.

The 1983 goal represented a 15 percent increase over 1982, which Fleischer said is still higher than the national average increase of 10 percent.

"Even though you don't reach that magic figure there's still a lot of positive things you have to look at," he said.

Williams said he thinks the whole local United Way organization is running exceptionally well.

According to the organization's bylaws, any person who has contributed money during the present year or the year before is a voting member. This includes everyone from the philanthropist to the kindergarten and makes the local membership include thousands.

Yet Fleischer said the average attendance at election meetings is about 30. The bylaws require a membership quorum of 27.

He said the board members are virtually hand-picked and are invited to serve on the board.

They serve three-year terms and are allowed a maximum of two terms. The terms are staggered so that only 12 positions are vacant in any given year, thus preventing premature evolutions.

This year eight of the board members up for election are eligible and are running for their second term. Fleischer said their reelection will be almost automatic, leaving only four of the 30 positions to be filled.

4 twisters flail east Louisiana

GREENSBURG, La. — At least four tornadoes whipped through southeast Louisiana Sunday, injuring more than a dozen people and ripping apart houses and trees and toppling power lines.

St. Helena Parish sheriff's deputy W.M. Smith said the injured were treated and released, but their identities were not available.

He said the twister first touched down about 4 miles east of Greensburg, ripping apart mobile homes and damaging houses. The tornado then skipped over to an area west of the city, knocking trailer homes off their blocks and destroying timber land.

"Property damage was really high (to) residences and trailers," Smith said. "Some were torn all to pieces. Other than that we were pretty lucky. They had some timber and property damage. It's just tremendous."

He said most of the damage occurred to dairy farms, homes, trailer homes and timber, but it would take officials several days to estimate damages.

Another tornado touched down on Louisiana Highway 449 about 11 miles southeast of Groves, slightly injuring a person and causing some property damage.

A third twister dipped to ground near Shiloh, snapping power lines and snapping limbs. A spokesman for the Gephahoa Parish Sheriff's Office said the tornado caused moderate damage when it touched down near Louisiana Highway 1054.

In Jefferson Parish, a twister touched through the Oak subdivision in Marrero Sunday, severely damaging and ripping roofs off houses. One was injured, a sheriff's deputy said.

Heavy winds also snapped power lines and caused damage in Mathews and land.

Much of east-central Louisiana was hit by a flash flood water earth after up to 5 inches of rain across the area. Minor flooding was reported in lying areas.
