There were more Tech cheerleaders at the games than basketball players and the Raiders suffered through an 11-20 season, the first losing campaign since Myers took over the team

But because of Myers' ability to get the most out of a team, it was expected Tech would be back in a hurry. And the Raiders made it back even quicker than

Texas Tech won its fifth consecutive game Saturday night, drubbing Pepperdine in Lubbock, 82-64. Earlier in the week Pepperdine had beaten nationally ranked Wichita.
