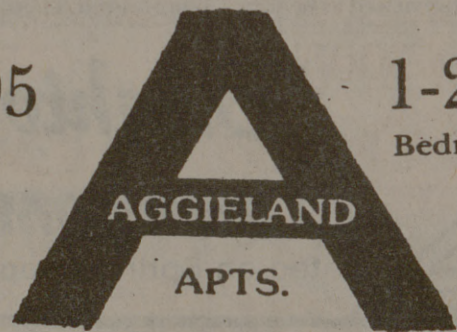

Cowboys deny report of sale to NBA owner

United Press International DALLAS — The Dallas Cowboys have opened their books to prospective buyers, club president and general manager Tex Schramm said Tuesday.

Schramm also denied a San Antonio television station's report that the club had already been sold to the owner of a National Basketball Association franchise — in violation of National Football League ownership rules — and that an announcement would be made after the end of the football season.

"There is no foundation to that, whatsoever," Schramm

said. There are a lot of people the Cowboys management would not consider appropriate owners because of the NFL rules, Schramm said.

The timing of an announcement doesn't make any difference either, Schramm said. "It would have no effect on the players or anything like that," Schramm said. "There is no special magic about announcing anything at the end of the season. But it will probably take that long to do it (sell the club) anyway."

"This is not something that is going to fast. Five or six people have sent their auditors in to look at our books. But after they have looked at our books, we haven't heard from them again. "That is understandable. They have to go back in their own business situation and see how they would structure it from a tax standpoint."

"They have to do their homework and that takes a long time." Schramm is searching for a buyer at the request of the families of Clint and John Murchison. The brothers each owned 45 percent of the franchise. John Murchison died three years ago and Clint Murchison, who has been in ill health for the past year, has decided to sell the franchise.



UT ticket prices will rise to \$15

United Press International AUSTIN — Tickets to University of Texas home football games in 1984 will be increased from \$12 to \$15 to help pay for improvements at Memorial Stadium and cover inflation.

UT Athletic Director DeLoss Dodds said Tuesday the price levels will be fixed for three years if financial conditions permit.

Proceeds from the increased approved Monday by the UT Men's Athletic Council will be used to build additional rest rooms and upgrade maintenance at the 75,500-seat stadium.

It was announced Monday that the university may build a \$7 million football dressing room and practice complex at Memorial Stadium.

High School Hall of Fame inducts 17

United Press International ORLANDO, Fla. — Four Olympians Jesse Owens, Ryan and Oscar Robertson headed a list of 17 individuals inducted into the National School Sports Hall of Fame banquet ceremonies Tuesday night.

The banquet was being held in conjunction with the National Conference of High School Directors of Athletics. A national fund-raising campaign is currently underway to build a million High School Hall of Fame in Kansas City, Mo.

Owens, Ryan and Robertson were among six athletes in the 1983 induction class and were joined by six coaches, four administrators and one contest official.

Owens won nine state titles at East Technical High School in Cleveland, Ohio in 1936 four gold medals at the 1936 Olympic in Berlin. He became the first prepster to run a sub-four minute mile as a year old at East High School in Wichita, Kan., and competed in the 1968 and 1972 Olympics. Robertson led Crispus Attles High School of Indianapolis, Ind., to back-to-back state titles in 1955-56 and played for the gold-medal winning U.S. basketball team at the 1960 Olympics.

Other athletes inducted were Bill Bradley of Crystal City, Mo. Dwight Eddleman of Central Ill., and Ken Hall of Sugar Land.
