Geter refuses lie detector, confident of being cleared

DENMARK, S.C. - Black engineer Lenell Geter said Tues-day he refused a lie-detector test that could have cleared him of armed robbery charges because the examiner isn't qualified.

"Tve taken three polygraph tests and passed those and I think the whole thing is un-necessary," Geter told UPI in a telephone interview.

"I think they'll drop the charges," he said. "I have faith. I'm looking at it from a spiritual point of view."

Geter, 26, was sentenced to life in prison for the stickup but the conviction was overturned in December

• When he was released on an appeal bond, Dallas County District Attorney Henry Wade said he would drop the charges if Ge-ter passed a polygraph test administered by Bill Parker, a

Geter had until Monday to Dallas police officer who owns a polygraph business.

"I have always said I'm going at the advice of my attorneys and agree with them, we're not going with Parker because he's a part-time examiner," Geter said. "He doesn't have the proper credentials to issue the test."

The engineer said he would prefer an examiner with "at least something to say that he's not necessarily doing this on the side as a tree-shade mechanic might do.

"In effect this is my life and I I'm tired of it."




