ABOARD AIR FORCE ONE - The helicopter carrying President Reagan from the White House to Andrews Air Force Base, Md., made an emergencg Thursday when a red warning light went on. Reagan was unhurt and never in any danger, a White House official said.

Reagan was en route to Atlanta for a political appearance when the incident occurred aboard his Marine One chopper. The helicopter landed at Anacostia Naval Air Station where the Reagan party transferred to another craft.

The president was joking as he boarded the second "This one's all right," he said. "I kicked the tires on it." White House Deputy Press

Secretary Larry Speakes said it had not been determined whether there was a problem with the chopper, or merely a faulty warning light.

Speakes briefed reporters

on the incident aboard Air Force One as they returned from Atlanta.
