Grandstaff jury causes delay in trial closing

AMARILLO — U.S. District Judge Mary Lou Robinson was expected Monday to rule on numerous motions filed in the \$5 million civil suit stemming from the shooting death of cowboy James Grandstaff, court officials said.
Court officials said closing arguments were slated for 2 p.m. Tuesday. They had been scheduled for 10 p.m. Tuesday after being delayed both Friday and Monday because jury instructions were not completed. Police officers have said they

mistook Grandstaff for a fugitive they were hunting near his 6666 Ranch home on Aug. 11, 1981.
Testimony indicated Grandstaff, a camp foreman, was shot once in the back when he went to help the officers. Grandstaff's widow, Sharon, filed the suit against the city of Borger, the counties of Hutchinson, Carson and Gray, and five of six officers present at the time of the shooting.
One of the officers is a Hutchinson County deputy and the rest are current or past Borger policemen, court records showed.

All motions from attorneys for the three Panhandle counties said Texas law makes counties and municipalities immune from legal action stemming from negligent actions of their employees.
Amarillo attorney Wayne Sturdivant filed the motion for the city of Borger, saying the city should not be held liable because Borger's police policy was not responsible for the shooting.

"Without admitting, and denying always, that it was a bullet fired by a member of the Borger Police Department which produced the death, the defendant would respectfully direct the court's attention to the fact that the evidence in this case is without dispute that the death came about by reason of a mistaken identity," Sturdivant wrote.

Federal court officials said pending motions included requests from each of the defendants for a directed verdict acquitting them. Those motions were filed upon completion of testimony last week in the 3-

Plane crash claim lives of passengers

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Three people ferrying a twin-engine turboprop Britt Airways plane to Evansville, Ind., died early Monday in a fiery crash about 1 mile from the airport, police said.
The three Britt employees were the only occupants of the plane that was to be based at Dress Regional Airport at Evansville to serve airline passengers. It was not a scheduled flight.
Police identified the victims as the pilot, Delbert Huffman, 64, of Terre Haute; co-pilot Gary Gerber, 55, of Evansville, and Brian Leahy, 25, a Britt customer service representative from the Terre Haute office.
State police said the plane crashed into a field about 1 mile from Hullman Field. There was a small fire at the crash and debris was scattered as far as 1,000 feet from the point of impact, investigators said.
FAA investigators were on the scene to determine the cause of the crash.
Airport officials reported it was raining and foggy with temperatures in the 30s. The plane was listed as 5 miles.
The plane was a Beechcraft Metro capable of carrying 12 passengers, Britt officials said.

Jury may coin the indictment

NEWARK, N.J. — A grand jury indicted two Jersey brothers Monday on charges of receiving part of a million collection of stolen silver coins stolen by an exhibitor at a Manhattan show in 1982.
The two-count indictment charged Thomas Riccio, 34, of Point Pleasant, and his brother Paul, 24, of Garfield, with conspiracy and receipt of stolen property. If convicted, they could face up to 15 years in prison and up to \$20,000 each.
The coins, containing gold, were snatched from a representative of the Mint at the Rarities and Curiosities Co. of Dallas in the lobby of the Convention Center in May 1982.
The indictment charged the brothers received some 100,000 coins taken in the heist. Riccio sold them for \$300,000 in August 1982 to a coin collector in Wallington. Those coins, in excess of \$500,000, were recovered by the FBI in an unsuspecting coin dealer's store.
Thomas Riccio, a grand jury attendant, was arrested by FBI agents and released after posting a \$10,000 surety. His brother, a tobacco salesman, has not been arrested.
