Bomb suspect sought

DALLAS — Police questioned a 21-year-old security guard Thursday and searched the Houston area for a second suspect in the death of a man killed by a bomb placed in a newspaper vending rack.

Marshall Dewayne Williams, 21, of Mesquite turned himself in to police shortly after midnight Thursday, police spokesman Bob Shaw reported.

"He was arrested here at police headquarters," Shaw said. "He came in to talk to police about the case. He didn't come in here to surrender as such. He just came in to talk. It was later that the arrest was made."

Williams was arrested in investigation of murder in the death of Ward Keeton, 63, who died when a bomb exploded Jan. 27 as he pulled a copy of the Dallas Morning News from a rack at his apartment complex.

Keeton, a property supervisor for a real estate management firm, was killed instantly when the pipe bomb exploded at about 5:15 a.m.

Shaw would not say if police had determined a motive in the bombing.

Williams Thursday appeared before a magistrate at the Lew Sterrett Justice Center and was placed under a \$50,000 bond.

Shaw said authorities were also searching the Houston area for a second suspect in the case.

Richard Garner, a special agent with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms in Dallas, said more arrests were possible.

"It's still an ongoing investigation, and several leads are being followed by the Dallas police department and Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearm agents working together," he said.

Garner said fragments of the bomb were still being tested at the ATF lab in San Francisco.

Prosecutor says Harrelson hurt by witnesses' testimony

SAN ANTONIO — A federal prosecutor said hitman Charles Harrelson, convicted of murdering U.S. Judge John H.

Wood Jr., had a strong defense until witnesses placed Harrelson at a local motel the night before the killing.

"I was practically doing cartwheels in court when I found out," said assistant U.S. Attorney Ray Jahn, who presented the case in the fall of 1982.

Jahn and his wife, Lela Jahn, who aided in the prosecution, talked extensively about the case for the first time Wednesday at a meeting of the Antonio Rotarians.

Jahn said Harrelson's story about the night before the killing were not known until after witnesses gave "uncontradicted proof" that he stayed at a motel in north San Antonio.

Before the evidence emerged late in the trial, Jahn said, Harrelson had a strong defense against conviction.

Wood was shot in the back outside his San Antonio apartment May 29, 1979, promising a three-year, \$7 million negotiation, said to equal that of an assassination of President J.F. Kennedy.

Mrs. Jahn said Harrelson "left little footprints" of his in the alibi he used, including the names Brett and J. Maverick and Palladin at "Have Gun, Will Travel" session series.

After obtaining search warrants for the El Paso homes of Jimmy and Joseph Chagra, FBI brought in its top safecracker because "we knew the Garas loved safes," Jahn said.

"He was truly amazing opening 11 safes in three hours in 30 minutes," Jahn said. "The FBI told me later that the thing the warrant turned up a list of combinations."

Jimmy Chagra was eventually acquitted of conspiring to murder Wood but was convicted of obstructing the government investigation. Joseph Chagra pleaded guilty to conspiring in the case and received a 10-year prison sentence.

The probe took investigators to Japan, where parts are manufactured for the Weather Mark IV rifle, the type used to kill Wood. Jahn said the mark was on the rifle but only part of the murder weapon ever recovered.

Investigators also interviewed a man who claimed that Harrelson had parked his car in the Dallas parking lot just two hours before Wood was killed in San Antonio, some 285 miles away.

The man said he was using a Rolls Royce car because a Rolls Royce was always parked in the same spot. Harrelson, the owner of the Rolls, refuted the parking lot attendant's story with proof that he parked his car there on the day of a cataract operation, Jahn said.
