# Miller named to committee

Jarvis Miller, former president of Texas A&M, has been named to a special issues committee for Richard Smith, the Republican candidate for the 14th district seat of the state Legislature.

In a press conference Thursday, Smith said the committee was set up to investigate major issues of concern to people in Brazos County.






