# Lawyers prepare to open defense for nurse accused of killing infant

GEORGETOWN — Attorneys for accused killer Genene Jones made final preparations Wednesday for the opening of defense testimony, but refused to say whether their week's worth of witnesses would include the nurse herself.

Prosecutors rested their case Tuesday against Jones, who is accused of killing 15-month-old Chelsea McClellan

with a drug injection. The state's case spanned nearly three and a half weeks and included 44 witnesses.

After a daylong break in the trial Wednesday, defense attorneys were scheduled to begin presenting evidence Thursday.

An assistant to lead defense lawyer Jim Brookshire said attorneys expected defense testimony to last about a week, but would not say if Jones

would be called to the witness stand.

"Our not having to tell the state what we're going to do is the only weapon we have," said assistant Patty Jones. "They've pulled plenty of surprises on us so we're being quiet on them."

The prosecution's key witness against Jones was her former employer, Dr. Kathleen Holland. The Kerrville pediatrician testified for eight days

about events surrounding Chelsea's death and similar unexplained emergencies in several other young patients.

Chelsea allegedly was injected with succinylcholine, a powerful muscle relaxant that paralyzes the body and halts breathing. Jones also has been charged with injuring six other Kerrville children with similar drug injections, but no trial

dates have been set on those charges.

Although prosecutors claimed they were not obligated to prove a motive for Chelsea's death, several witnesses bolstered the theory that Jones caused emergencies in babies to show a need for a special unit to care for critically ill children in Kerrville's small Sid Peterson Hospital.

## Burglar tackled, sat on

AUSTIN — Two women tackled a burglar suspect fleeing from a closed convenience store early Wednesday and sat on him until police arrived.

Sgt. Robert Cervenka said the women were driving by the store around 2 a.m. when they saw the suspect emerging from

a hole in the glass in front of the store.

"They get out of their car, tackle him and hold him down until one of their friends calls police," he said.

When police arrived on the scene, Cervenka said they found the women, Stacy Horn, 19, and Donya Huckaby, 20, both of Austin, sitting on the man. Unopened cans of beer

and cigarettes were scattered around them.

Police said the man had been drinking but offered no resistance after being tackled by the women.

Ernest Sanchez Rodriguez, 25, of Austin was charged with burglary of a business and jailed under \$5,000 bond.
