Associate dean to be inducted a fellow of AIAA

Dr. Leroy "Skip" Fletcher carries a big title — associate dean of the College of Engineering — but the man behind the prestige says he loves working with students. Throughout his career, Fletcher has been showered with many awards and honors for his performance as an engineering educator. And the honors keep coming.

In May, Fletcher will be inducted as a fellow of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics. A fellow is a

rank of distinction within the AIAA that is given annually to only 25 of its almost 25,000 members.

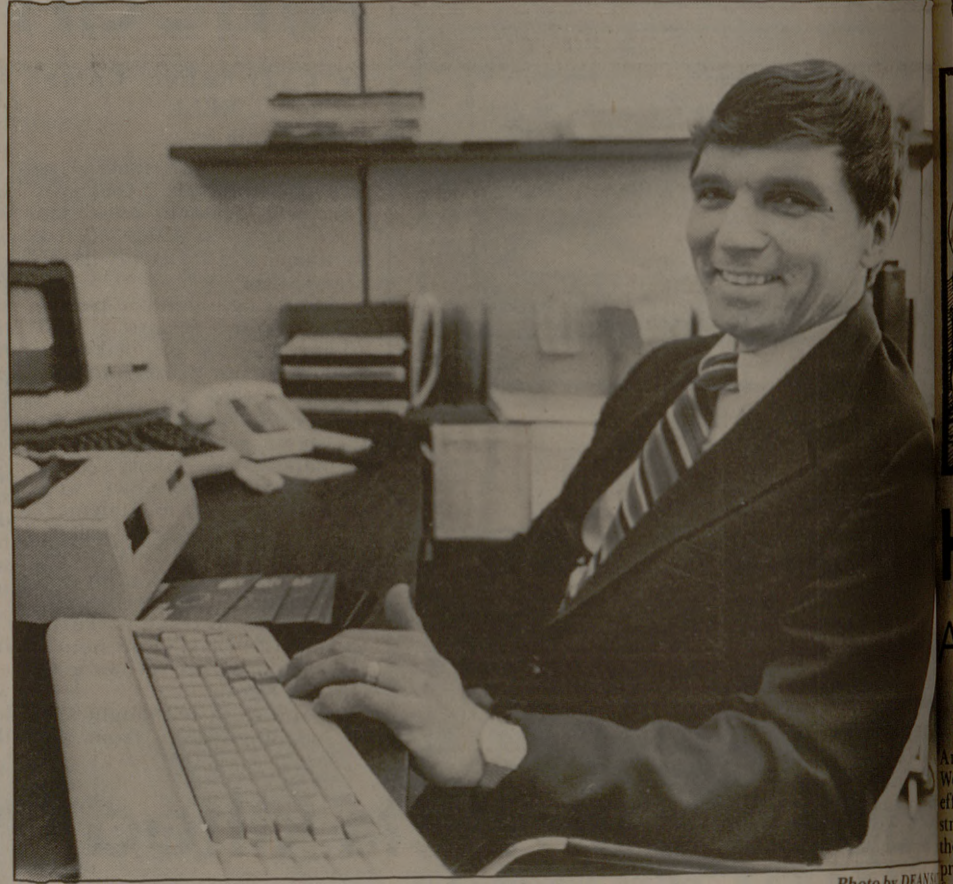
Also a member of the Board of Directors of the AIAA, Fletcher said he was especially pleased with the honor since it is rarely given to educators.

His extensive work in aeronautics began in 1958 after he graduated from Texas A&M. Armed with a degree in mechanical engineering, Fletcher went to work as a research scientist at the NASA-Ames Research Center for six years.

Since then he's headed the aerospace engineering department at the University of Virginia and has served as chairman of several national aeronautic conferences.

But Fletcher is much more than a package of credentials and honors. He is a well-rounded person whose curiosity has taken him around the world. His brown eyes betray the adventure of his spirit as he recalls the places he's been in his lifetime.

Before he married, Fletcher had visited Thailand, Japan, India, Vietnam, and much of Europe. He'd seen the pyramids in Egypt and the temples in

Greece. He'd worked on farms in Finland and Norway, and in an opera house in San Francisco.

Every May Fletcher combines his love for travel and students by taking a three-week trip to

Europe. This year he will go to Holland, Belgium, and Germany.

Fletcher calls himself a people-oriented person, which has been one of the keys to his success. His charisma and warmth

create a comfortable sphere for exchange with students.

But when asked why he has been so successful in his reply was: "Because Aggie."

Work begins on building ME, physics to get additional

Construction began this week on the \$12 million physics and mechanical engineering building. The structure will stand

next to the Cyclotron across the street from the Zachry Engineering Center.

Part of the building will have four stories in a round shape that will serve as office space. A second wing, connected to the offices, will house classrooms and laboratories.

"We need a lot more research space for undergraduates and graduates," Dr. Robert Tribble, head of the physics department, said. "We recommended another building five years ago because of the short quantity of space for programs."

Dr. Make McDermott, a professor of mechanical engineering, said the new building will reduce the department's space problems but won't end them.

"We will need about twice as much room when the new building is completed," he said.

Faculty and staff who had parked in lot 7, which is now the construction site, will use lots 50 and 51. Those lots are across from the Zachry Engineering Center.

"These people have known about the change since Septem-

ber, so this should be no surprise," a University Police man said.

The building should be completed in two years, construction manager Bob Egan said.

A chemistry building system administration are next on the calendar for construction, Charles L. Johnson, manager for the planning, which is expected to be completed by the end of the year. The building will be used for undergraduate classrooms and teaching. The building will be used for chemistry annex. Construction will start as soon as the plan is approved.

Construction of the administration building will begin at the end of the year if approved in September. The building will be located on the corner of University and near the married student center, and across the street from Skaggs Alpha Beta store. The present Building will be used by new administrators while the new building is completed, fee said.
