The background, as de-scribed by Tice and from a re-port in "Southern Reserch," the institute's quarterly bulletin:

- Natural LH-RH was discovered in 1971 by Dr. Andrew Shally who showed LH-RH is necessary for the release of LH and FSH, two hormones that are essential elements of the reproductive process in males and females.

— The release of LH and FSH from the pituitary sets off a chemical reaction, which ends in the release of an egg from the ovary. In the male, a similar sequence of chemical steps of sequence of chemical steps oc-curs. The result in males is the production of testosterone, the male hormone which causes when the drug stops testostesperm production.

- Research shows after the injection, the LH-RH derivatives bind to the pituitary and block flow of LH and FSH from
