Houston to recall **EDB** rice

FRANKFORT, Ky. — Comet Rice Mills of Houston has agreed to recall batches of its long-grain brown rice from Kentucky store shelves, the state said Wednesday. The rice has EDB pesticide levels three times than the federal limit.

Samples taken at a Winn-Dixie supermarket warehouse in Louisville showed EDB levels of 453.3 parts per billion. The federal government has set 150 parts per billion as the maximum safe level of the pesticide.

The batches of rice affected are in 14-ounce packages coded

Fourteen other grain-based items tested by the state showed acceptable levels of the pesticide, which is used to help preserve stored grains


