Rattlesnakes

13,000 diamondbacks to meet 25,000 spectators at Roundup

SWEETWATER — If rattlesnake hunting at the Sweetwater snake roundup proves as good as it did last year, about 13,000 western diamondbacks will be squirming inside pits at the Nolan County Coliseum on March 8-11.

Publicity manager Rick Rhodes estimated about 400 hunters will participate in the 26th annual roundup, and some 25,000 people are expected for the festivities.

"I strictly involve myself with the administrative end of it," Rhodes said. "There's some experienced hunters that have been in it for a long time, but we've had different winners for the last several years."

Meanwhile, those who would consider themselves in the wrong place anytime they're confronted with a rattler can tag along behind experienced hunting guides for a demonstration.

"A beginner could be in the right place at the right time," he added of the hunting contests.

Scheduled activities include a parade, Miss Snake Charmer beauty pageant, gun and coin show, one-act plays, flea market, 10-kilometer run and an eating contest.

Trophies are given for the hunter bringing in the most pounds of live rattlesnake and for the longest snake. Last year's champion was 68 inches, and the average catch weighed about 1 pound.

Hourly tours leave the coliseum between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Friday, Saturday and Sunday for those who only want to catch snakes with their cameras.

"It got started because rattlesnakes were such a threat to the livestock," Rhodes said. "Since that time it has grown into a sporting event and a way to raise funds for some charities."

The Jaycees earn about \$20,000 from the annual roundup, with most of it donated to the Sunshine Inn training center for the mentally handicapped.

"The whole theme of a roundup is to stress safety," Rhodes said. "If you're going live in this part of the country, you're going to come across snakes."

"It's the greatest event in America. Proceeds go for worthwhile organizations and we see the results of it all round."

El Paso area may be film site

EL PASO — Scenes for a television mini-series based on James A. Michener's novel

"Space" may be shot in West Texas later this year. A Paramount Pictures representative has been checking shooting sites for the series, the

film liaison for the city and county of El Paso said.

Joe Sierra said the two three weeks of filming could add \$1 million to the area economy.

Episodes being considered for shooting in the El Paso area are from the beginning of the book, when German scientists and their families come to El Paso after World War II, work on rocket programs, and scientists were here illegally according to the book, and had to be taken to Mexico and allowed to enter through Juarez.

The scientists crossed the Santa Fe Street bridge leading into the downtown area of El Paso, but that bridge has been replaced.

The filmmakers will use the bridge in Fabens, 30 miles east of El Paso, because it is close to what the old El Paso-Juarez bridge looked like, said Robert L. Knight, executive director of the convention and visitors bureau.

Some of the filming will take place east of El Paso in San Antonio because of the town's "Mexican flavor," Knight said. Other scenes will be shot at Bliss. Only a small portion of the six-hour series will be filmed in El Paso itself.

Filmmakers said they will shoot in Juarez, Mexico, because of potential delays in getting approval from Mexico.

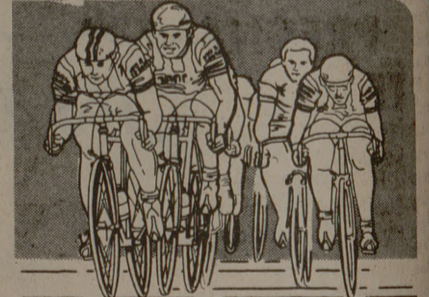
